- 1.** The **petitioner, Deepak Jha**, apprehends his arrest in connection with **Shastri Nagar P.S. Case No. 429 of 2026**, registered under Sections 109, 115(2), 118(1), 126(2), 351(2), 352 read with Section 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.
- 2.** Heard Sri Arvind Kumar Mouar, learned counsel for the petitioner and Sri Rajesh Kumar, learned Public Prosecutor for the State.
- 3.** The prosecution case, in brief, is that the informant, Rishu Kumar Mishra, is employed as a Junior Engineer at I.G.I.M.S., Patna. On 20.05.2026 at approximately 3:30 P.M., he allegedly received a call from the petitioner, who is associated with the Radiology Department, informing him of a complaint concerning the department and requesting his presence at the office. Shortly thereafter, it is alleged that 10 to 12 persons, including the petitioner and one Amit @ Ajit, entered the informant's office and began assaulting him. With the intervention of others present, the informant managed to escape, following which the accused persons left the premises.

It is further alleged that on 21.05.2026, the informant, along with his father, submitted a written complaint before the Director's Office and other authorities of I.G.I.M.S. Subsequently, the petitioner, along with co-accused Kumar Gaurav and Amit @ Ajit Kumar, accompanied by approximately 50-60 individuals described as doctors or medical students, allegedly arrived armed with sharp-edged weapons and iron rods with the intention to kill the informant. The accused persons are stated to have brutally assaulted the informant, his father Ashok Mishra, and one Aman Kumar, an electrician.

The prosecution specifically alleges that the petitioner inflicted a blow on the informant's head using a sharp-edged weapon, causing a bleeding injury. It is further alleged that the co-accused assaulted the informant's father and Aman Kumar with iron rods and sharp weapons, resulting in multiple injuries. Aman Kumar is stated to have sustained a head injury, while the informant's father suffered injuries on various parts of his body. It is also alleged that, in order to save themselves, the informant and his father locked themselves inside a room, while the accused attempted to break open the door. Upon the arrival of the local administration, all the accused persons fled from the scene.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated. It is contended that no such incident, as alleged, took place. According to the defence, the informant, being a Junior Engineer at I.G.I.M.S., had failed to address a defect in the air-conditioning system of the Radiology Department, prompting doctors of the department to submit a written complaint against him. It is further submitted that, in response, the informant, along with his associates, came to the Radiology Department, where they began abusing the doctors. When objections were raised, the informant and his associates allegedly became aggressive, resulting in a scuffle between both parties. It is also submitted that there exists a case and counter-case between the parties. Furthermore, it is emphasized that the petitioner is a medical student in the Radiology Department at I.G.I.M.S., Patna, and has no prior criminal antecedent.

5. Learned Public Prosecutor opposes the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. However, he fairly submits that the informant Rishu Kumar Mishra, his father Mishra and one Aman Kumar, who have been alleged to have suffered injury which is simple in nature. He further submits that nothing contrary is mentioned in the case diary with regard to the pleading on behalf of the petitioner in para 3 of the anticipatory bail application that he

has clean criminal antecedent.

6. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case; the nature of accusation; injury suffered by the injured persons being simple in nature, and petitioner's clean antecedent, the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail of the above-named petitioner is **allowed**. It is ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned court below within four weeks from the date of receipt of this order, the above-named petitioner shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
