ORDER.

12-03-2026 This regular bail petition has been filed on behalf of the above-named petitioner, who is in Judicial custody since 28-12-2025 in connection with Maner P.S. Case No. 987 of 2025 registered under Sections 137(2), 96, 3(5) of the B.N.S., pending in the Court of Md. Arbaz Ansari, learned J.M.-Ist Class, Danapur.

It is submitted on behalf of the petitioner that earlier no any anticipatory or regular bail petition has been filed before this learned Court. It is further submitted by a supplementary petition that this is the first regular bail application of the petitioner and no any bail petition is pending in any Court. It is further submitted that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case. The petitioner is innocent and has committed no any offence. The petitioner is ready to undertake that he will appear each and every date in future after granting of the bail. The petitioner is in custody since 28-12-2025. Hence, he may be enlarged on bail.

Learned Addl. P.P. opposed the payer for bail.

As per FIR, on 20-12-2025, the informant's minor daughter aged about 15 years went to a grocery shop to purchase some goods, but did not return and then the informant Mamta Devi and her mother Rekha Devi searched for her but they did not get any clue about her and then the informant dialled co-accused Riya Devi, who laughed upon her and told that her daughter had fled away with Aryan Kumar, the petitioner and the F.I.R. was lodged against the petitioner and co-accused Riya Devi under Sections 137(2), 96, 3(5) of the B.N.S.

Perused the record. On perusal of the same, it transpires that the prosecution version finds support from it. During investigation, the victim minor girl was recovered and her statement under Section 183 B.N.S.S. was recorded, wherein she stated that on 20-12-2025, she called the petitioner by phone and requested him to go with her for a tour, but due to death of a family member in the house of the petitioner's mother, they could not go for the tour and she resided in the house of the petitioner and his mother and when she got knowledge about the case, she returned to her house on 27-12-2025. Apparently, there is no allegation against the petitioner that he seduced the minor girl in any manner to left her house rather she voluntarily left her house to go for a tour. It is

submitted and claimed on behalf of the petitioner that he has no criminal antecedents and the learned APP also failed to produce criminal antecedents of the petitioner inspite of sufficient opportunity provided therefor. The petitioners are in custody since 28-12-2025.

Having considered aforesaid including the period of custody of the petitioner and his clean antecedents, let the above-named petitioner **Aryan Kumar @ Mithlesh Kumar**, be released on bail, on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Court concerned, subject to the conditions that :-

1. One of the bailors must be the resident of the native place of the accused-petitioner,
2. The petitioner shall not commit similar offence in future,
3. If at any stage of the case it is revealed to the Court concerned that the petitioner has concealed his criminal antecedents to get bail, his bail bond shall be cancelled by the Court concerned and
4. The petitioner shall fully cooperate in the investigation/trial of the case and shall be properly represented before the Court concerned.
