Anticipatory Bail Petition No.483/2026
(Arising out of Bikram P.S. Case No.39/2026)

The petitioners 1. Amarjeet Paswan, aged about 34 yrs. S/o Kamlesh Paswan 2. Vikash Paswan, aged about 23 yrs. S/o Anil Paswan 3. Hari Om Paswan, aged about 34 yrs. S/o Dhunni Paswan 4. Amarnath Paswan, aged about 31 S/o Kamlesh Paswan, all resident of village Arap, P.S. Bikram, Dist. Patna have filed the present anticipatory bail petition as they are apprehending their arrest in connection with instant Bikram P.S. Case No.39/2026, dt.23-01-2026, registered U/Ss.126(2), 115(2), 74, 109, 352, 351(2) and 3(5) of the B.N.S. which is pending in the Court of A.C.J.M. VI, Danapur.

Heard the ld. Lawyer of the petitioners, as well as, the ld. Addl.P.P. of the state on the aforesaid bail petition.

The learned lawyer that the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners have no criminal antecedent, however, the prosecution case, as per, the written-application of the informant, in brief, is as such: On 23-01-2026, the informant Sunil Kumar, S/o Mangru Ram, R/o of village Arap, P.S. Bikram, Dist. Patna submitted his application to the S.H.O. Bikram P.S. in which he has alleged that on the same day at 6 o'clock when he was at his home, then due to previous dispute all the accused persons/petitioners and one Baban Kumar started beating them with lati, danda and iron-rod, causing fracture of his head and the head of his son Rohit Kumar. The informant has further alleged that the accused persons also hit upon the head of his mother and hit upon the stomach of his wife by leg. After that the nearby people assembled and then they fled away threatening him if they lodge case they will kill them.

The learned lawyer of petitioners has submitted that no anticipatory and regular bail has been filed by the petitioners either in this Court or in the Hon'be High Court, Patna. He has further submitted that the petitioners are quite innocent and they have committed no any offence as alleged. He has further submitted that there is no direct and specific allegation against the petitioners, rather the same is vague, general and with bad motive. He has further submitted that nothing has happened, and the allegations levelled against the petitioners are totally false and baseless and not corroborate with the injury report. He has further submitted that there is case and counter case between the

parties. He has further submitted that the counter case i.e. Bikram P.S. Case No.39/2026 and Bikram P.S. Case No.39/2026 have been compromised out side of the court, due to the intervention of well wishers of both the parties with free will. He has further submitted that the co-accused Baban Kumar has already been granted bail by this Court, vide its order dt.18-02-2026. Lastly, he has submitted that the petitioners belong to a respectable family and they are law abiding citizen, so there is no chance of their absconding. So, the petitioners may be granted anticipatory bail.

On Perusal of the case record, it appears that a joint compromise petition dt.23-02-2026 has been filed on behalf of the above named petitioners and informant of this case, in which it has been stated that due to the intervention of their relatives and punches, they have compromised the present case with the informant in out side the court. Due to compromise they further do not want to proceed with the case, and accordingly, they have (parties) put their signatures on the joint compromise petition. Hence, they prayed to accept the compromise petition filed on behalf of them.

On perusal of compromise petition, it appear that the same is in order, so the joint compromise petition dt. 23-02-2026 filed on behalf of the parties is accepted. The Ld. Addl. P.P. have also supported the factum of compromise between the parties.

Considering the fact that the parties have of compromised the case, I think it will be proper to grant anticipatory bail to the above named petitioners. It is ordered that the petitioners be released on bail after furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each. Let a copy of the order be sent to the Court concerned at once.
