26-05-2026. The Anticipatory Bail Petition No. 891 of 2026 and A.B.P. No. 980 of 2026 arise out of same Maner P.S. Case No. 212 of 2026 and thus the same are being disposed of by this common order.

Heard the learned counsels for the petitioners above-named, who apprehend their arrest in connection with Maner P.S. Case No. 212 of 2026 registered under Sections 190, 191(2), 191(3), 115(2), 117(2), 109, 308(3) and 351(2) of the B.N.S. and Section 27 of the Arms Act, pending in the Court of Md. Arbaz Ansari, learned J.M.F.C., Danapur.

Heard learned counsels for the parties.

It is submitted on behalf of the petitioners that earlier no any bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners either for grant of regular or anticipatory bail

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before this learned court or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. It is further submitted that no any other bail petition pending in any other Court and this is first Anticipatory Bail petition on behalf of the aforesaid petitioners. The petitioners have committed no offence and have been falsely implicated in this case due to previous enmity and land dispute. Both the sides are claiming their land in dispute. Title Suit No. 467 of 2025 is pending in the Court. These petitioners have no role at all whatsoever alleged in the instant case as nothing has happened at all in the manner and way as alleged in the F.I.R. There is general and omnibus allegation against these petitioners. All the Sections areailable except Sections 109 and 308(2) of the B.N.S. and Section 27 of the Arms Act, which are super addition and not attracted against these petitioners. There is no serious injury in this case. There is case and counter case between the parties. Other co-accused has already been granted bail vide order dated 13-04-2026 passed in A.B.P. No. 609 of 2026. The petitioners have clean antecedents. The petitioners are ready to abide by any condition imposed by this court and are ready to give sufficient sureties to the satisfaction of the learned court and there is no chance of their absconding. Hence, they may be given benefit of anticipatory bail.

Learned Addl. P.P. as well as learned lawyer of the informant opposed the prayer of bail of the petitioners.

As per F.I.R., the informant Anup Kumar, alleged that on 05-03-2026 at about 05.15 P.M. in the evening, when he was working with his laborers in the field (Plot No. 1573, 1574) taken on lease from Kumar Shailendra Singh. Then Mahesh Rai, along with approximately 50-75 people came armed with pistols and rifles and started firing with the intent to kill him and his laborers. The informant immediately informed Maner Police Station vide phone at 5.45 P.M. to send police force. After the firing, the criminals ran away and he could not catch them. The informant and others were injured and came to the Government Hospital for treatment, where all the injured were referred to P.M.C.H. Patna in serious condition. Among the criminal, he identified Hare Ram Rai, Manoranjan Rai, Dinesh Rai, Golu Bharti, Pradeep Kumar, Manish

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Kumar, Vinod Kumar, Deepak Kumar, Vishal Kumar, Mahesh Rai, Ritesh Kumar, Babulal Rai and Pappu Rai, and also named other persons, when find out their names. These people had previously shown the informant weapons and threatened to kill him, about which a written information was given to Maner Police Station. Today, those people came to kill him, against which action was taken against those criminals. Earlier also, when these people used to quarrel in this field, two case numbers bearing 112(M)/2025 and 800(M)/2025 were filed in S.D.M. Court, Danapur, and these people were also present in this group. On 03-03-2026 at about 2.00 O'clock in the afternoon, Maher Rai along with 15 people came to Plot No. 1573 (Thana No.6) and broke the fence around the land with wire and pole. Mahesh Rai said that if you do not give the extortion money, we will kill you and also loot the crop. Therefore, the informant requested to take this matter seriously and appropriate legal action against the aforesaid individuals and wants to get protection. On the basis of the written report of the informant, the F.I.R. was lodged under Sections 190, 191(2), 191(3), 115(2), 117(2), 109, 308(3) and 351(2) of the B.N.S. and Section 27 of the Arms Act.

Perused the record and the case diary. On perusal of the entire record, it appears that F.I.R. was registered under Sections 190, 191(2), 191(3), 115(2), 117(2), 109, 308(3) and 351(2) of the B.N.S. and Section 27 of the Arms Act with allegation to abuse, assault, firing, demand of extortion and threatened to kill the informant. So far, the case diary is concerned, the prosecution version prima facie finds support from the witnesses recorded in paragraph nos. 9 and 10 of the case diary. There is case and counter case between the parties. Previous enmity is admitted between the parties since long back. Land dispute is there between the parties. Injury report was not brought on the record. There is no ingredient of Sections 308(4) of the B.N.S. and nothing incriminating articles have been recovered from the place of occurrence. Other co-accused has already been granted bail vide order dated 13-04-2026 passed in A.B.P. No. 609 of 2026. Petitioners claimed to be clean antecedents. Investigation in the case is still going on.

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Having considered aforesaid including the facts and circumstances of the case, previous enmity, land dispute between the parties, case and counter case between the parties, and nature of allegation alleged against the petitioners, this Court finds fit for grant of anticipatory bail to the above-named petitioners. Accordingly, the above-named petitioners **Parween Kumar @ Pravind Kumar, Binod Kumar, Deepak Kumar, Vishal Kumar @ Visha Kumar, Guddu Bharti, Ritesh Kumar, Bablu Rai, Pappu Rai, and Mahesh Rai**, are directed to be released on bail, **till submission of charge-sheet**, in the event of their arrest or surrender within 30 days from the date of receipt/production of this order, on furnishing bonds of Rs. 10,000/-each with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Court concerned, subject to the conditions that (1) one of the bailors must be the native place of the petitioners (2) The petitioners shall file affidavit/undertaking that they will not commit similar offence in future and (3) the petitioners shall fully cooperate in the investigation/trial of the case and (4) if at any stage it will revealed that the petitioners have concealed their criminal antecedents, the learned Court concerned shall cancel their bail bonds.
