Order.

01-06-2026 This Anticipatory Bail petition has been filed on behalf of the above-named petitioners, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Bihta P.S. Case No. 173 of 2026 registered under Sections 85 of the B.N.S., pending in the Court of learned A.C.J.M.- II, Danapur.

Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Apart from pleading innocence, false implication, clean antecedents and this to be the first bail application of the petitioners, learned counsel for the petitioners submit that the petitioner No. 1 is father-in-law and petitioner No. 2 is mother-in-law of the informant and they have no concern with their matrimonial relations. No specific allegation of cruelty has been attributed against these petitioners and the allegations are general and omnibus in nature. In the light of the above submissions, learned counsel prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Learned A.P.P. and learned counsel for the informant opposed the payer for bail.

Perused the record. On perusal of the same, it transpires that these petitioners are father-in-law and mother-in-law of the informant and the allegation of assault to the informant is directed against the co-accused Rajesh Kumar Singh, who is the husband of the informant. The offence is punishable for only upto seven years of imprisonment.

Therefore, considering all these facts and the ratio of the judgment laid down in the cases of **Arnesh Kumar vs. State of Bihar**, this Court is inclined to grant privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Hence, they are directed to be released, in the event of their arrest or surrender in the trial Court within Thirty (30) days from the date of this order upon their furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/-with two sureties of like amount each subject to condition as mentioned in Section 438 (2) of the Cr.P.C.

Let a copy of this order be sent to the concerned Court for information and needful.
