ORDER.

13-10-2025 A bail petition has been filed on behalf of the above-named accused, who is in Judicial custody since 02-04-2025. Copy of the same has been served to the learned Addl. P.P..

Heard the learned counsel for the accused and also the learned Addl. P.P..

It is submitted on behalf of the accused that earlier no any bail application either regular or anticipatory has been filed before this learned Court or before any Superior Court and this is the first bail application of the petitioner and no any bail petition of the petitioner is pending in any Court. It is further submitted that the petitioner is innocent and has committed no any offence. The petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and the allegation levelled against him is totally false and fabricated. The petitioner is ready to undertake that he will co-operate with the investigation and he is in custody since 02-04-2025. Hence, he may be enlarged on bail.

Learned Addl. P.P. vehemently opposed the prayer of bail.

As per F.I.R., on 01-04-2025, the petitioner Harendra Prasad asked money from the informant Ajay Yadav and he assured that he would give Rs. 200/- on next day after taking the same from someone, but he started abusing and assaulting the informant and the informant hid himself in his house but he did not stop and coming at his door again started abusing and upon this the informant's father Bachhan Yadav objected and then the petitioner beaten up him brutally. The villagers came and intervened in the matter. The informant's father was taken to Bikram hospital, where he was declared as dead. The dead body of the informant's father was sent to the Paliganj for postmortem. As per Fardbayan of the informant Ajay Yadav, the F.I.R. was lodged against the petitioner under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 103(1) and 352 of the B.N.S..

It is submitted and claimed on behalf of the petitioner that he has clean antecedents and the learned Addl. P.P. also failed to produce the criminal antecedents against the petitioner inspite of sufficient opportunity provided therefor.

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Perused the case diary. On perusal of the same, it transpires that the prosecution version finds support from it. There is allegation against the petitioner that he brutally assaulted the informant's father Bachhan Yadav and he succumbed to his injuries. The postmortem report show multiple injuries on the scalp and other places of the deceased and the cause of death has been shown due to head injury and its complications caused by hard and blunt object. The injury report of the informant Ajay Yadav also shows that he sustained injuries in the alleged occurrence but all are simple in nature. The charge-sheet has also been submitted against the petitioner under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 103(1) and 352 of the B.N.S. and the case is pending for trial.

Having considered aforesaid including the nature of allegation against the petitioner and the gravity of the offence, I am not inclined to enlarge the above-named accused **Harendra Yadav**, on bail. Accordingly, the prayer of bail of the said accused is hereby **rejected**.
