06 03.2026	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The present application has been preferred on behalf of the petitioners named above, apprehending their arrest in connection with Danapur P.S. Case No. 781 of 2025, registered for the offences punishable under Sections 316(2), 318(4) and 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are innocent and have been falsely implicated on mere conjectures and surmises. It is contended that the complainant and the accused petitioners are close relatives and it is alleged that they have deceitfully took away the valuables and cash as well as fixed deposits of the informant's worth Rs 18 lakhs. It is also alleged that, the petitioners took the informant to the post office and got their names inserted into the fixed deposit papers. It is further submitted that the petitioners have clean antecedents; the investigation has substantially completed and all the accused petitioners have been released by the police after complying with the provisions of Sec. 35(3) BNSS. They are ready to abide by any condition	Contd.

imposed by this Court. Hence prays to be enlarged on bail.

3. Per contra, learned Additional Public Prosecutor has strongly opposed the prayer for bail. It is submitted that the petitioners have deceitfully cheated the informant, a widow and illiterate lady, therefore do not deserve any leniency.
4. I have given my anxious consideration to the rival submissions and perused the case diary. Admittedly, the complainant and the petitioners are close relatives. Nothing incriminating has been discovered during the course of investigation. The petitioners were served notice u/s 35(3) of BNSS and were subsequently released on police bonds. The investigation of the case has substantially completed, though charge sheet is yet to be filed. Therefore, I am of the considered view that, the petitioners deserve the privilege of pre arrest bail in this case.
5. Accordingly, in the event of arrest or surrender before the court below within a period of six weeks from today, the petitioner, (1) Bicky Kumar @ Bicky Kumar Sah, (2) Babita Devi, (3) Rinki Kumari, (4) Vikash Kumar and (5) Ashish Kumar shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below, in connection with Danapur P.S. Case No. 781 of 2025, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482 BNSS, and further conditions that:
 6. (i) The petitioners shall cooperate with the trial and appear before the trial court on each and every date fixed unless exempted.
 - (ii) The petitioners shall not directly or indirectly

induce, threaten or promise any person acquainted with the facts of the case.

(iv) In case of violation of any of the conditions, the prosecution shall be at liberty to move for cancellation of bail.

7. It is made clear that any observation made herein is only for the purpose of disposal of the present anticipatory bail application and shall not prejudice the trial on merits.

8. Let a copy of this order be transmitted to the court concerned forthwith.
