Anticipatory Bail Petition Under Section 482 & 484 of BNSS

ORDER

This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner namely **1. Shyam Sundar Kumar 2. Madan Paswan**, who are apprehending to their arrest in connection with **Masaurhi P.S. Case No. 22/2026** for offence punishable **U/s 126(2), 115(4), 118(1), 109, 303(2), 352, 351(1), 3(5) of BNS** which is pending in the court of the SDJM, Masaurhi, is being pressed today and heard.

The case of prosecution on the basis of written information given by the Shatima Devi is that on 13.01.2026, her neighbours Shyam Sundar Paswan, Madan Paswan, Ram Niwas Paswan, Aman Kumar came to her house and broke the Khapra of the house and started abuse. When she came out of the house, they started to assault. Shyam Sundar with an iron khanti attacked her on the head causing head injuries and she started to bleed. He also snatched her jitiya from the neck. She fainted and when her husband came for the resue then he was also assaulted and sustained injury on the right hand.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of petitioners has submitted that petitioner has never moved earlier any bail petition either anticipatory or regular before this Court or before the Hon'ble Court. There is no any criminal antecedent against petitioner. Petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case. Petitioners and informant are gotia and due to village dirty politics the false and fabricated case has been lodged. Petitioner is willing to accept any condition as imposed by court. Petitioner is ready to furnish

sufficient sureties.

On the other hand the learned Addl. P.P. for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners abovenamed.

Heard both sides and perused the case record as well as the case diary. Para 31 of the CD shows no criminal antecedent of the petitioners. This is a case and counter case between the parties. Injury report of the informant Sakima Devi shows lacerated wound of size 2.5”X1.5”X1cm over right parietal region of the head with was of simple in nature.

Considering the above, this anticipatory bail is hereby allowed. Hence, it is ordered that in the event of their arrest or surrender within four weeks from this order, petitioners shall be directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand)** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court concerned in terms of Section 482 & 484 of the BNSS. Accordingly, this anticipatory bail petition is hereby disposed of.
