ORDER

This bail petition has been filed on behalf of petitioner **Aman Kumar** in connection with **Masaurhi P.S. Case No. 285/2025** for the offence **U/s 103(1), 61(2), 238 of BNS** which is pending in the court of the D.A.S.J.-II, Masaurhi is being pressed today and heard.

The case of the prosecution as per the written information given by the Arun Ram is that on 06.04.2025 at 8.00 AM, his son Jayprakash Kumar had gone to bring his wife Muskan but he did not return till night then, informant talked to his son on mobile and he replied that he had been invited to attend a function at the maternal-Aunt's house of Muskan but son of informant did not return till morning. On the next day at 11.00 hrs., Masaurhi P.S. informed him that his son's dead body has been found at Konhara More, Hansadih besides road in the bush. On information he saw that his son had been strangled to death. It is alleged that under conspiracy the wife of his son namely Muskan, mother-in-law Anita Devi, Aunt Nandani Kumari, Bablu Kumar, Saryug Paswan, Ashok Paswan, Prem Kumar & Aman Kumar have committed the murder of his son and after committing murder, Bablu Kumar and Prem Kumar @ Niranjan threw the dead body in the bushes. It is further alleged that his son had performed love marriage with girl of another caste and due to this, the members at his in-laws' house was unhappy.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner has submitted that petitioner had earlier filed an anticipatory bail application in the Hon'ble High Court of Patna which has been rejected in Cr. Misc. No. 86495/2025. Petitioner has no criminal antecedent as mentioned in the bail petition. Petitioner is in judicial custody since 11.03.2026. Petitioner is

quite innocent and has falsely been implicated in this false case. Petitioner will fully cooperate in the investigation of the case and will not misuse the bail. Petitioner is also ready to furnish proper sureties. Prayer has been made to enlarge petitioner on bail.

On the other hand the learned Addl. P.P. for the State vehemently opposed the prayer for regular bail of the petitioner.

Heard the argument of both sides and perused the case record as well as the case diary. The witnesses in the case diary has supported the prosecution version. Para-13 of the case diary reflects that the CCTV footage shows that at about 06:20:50 hrs. in morning two persons were going on the motorcycle and dead body was kept in between. Further in para-28 of the case diary, it is mentioned that CCTV footage shows that deceased was being carried on motorcycle. The postmortem report shows that the cause of death was due to head injury and its complication from blunt force. The allegation is serious having committed murder in a pre-planned manner under a conspiracy. Chargesheet has been submitted against the petitioner. Petitioner is in judicial custody since 11.03.2026.

Considering the above, I am not inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail at this stage, hence his prayer for bail is **rejected**. Accordingly, this bail petition is hereby disposed off.
