Anticipatory Bail Petition Under Section 482 of BNSS

ORDER

This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Nagina Nat 2. Chaneshwar Nat 3. Sadhu Nat 4.Chandan Nat 5.Suraj Nat 6.Sarchuniya Devi**, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with **Masaurhi P.S. Case No. 511/2026** for offence punishable **U/ss 126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109, 74, 303(2), 351(2), 352, 3(5) of the BNS**, which is pending in the court of the SDJM, Masaurhi is being pressed and heard today.

The case of prosecution on the basis of written information given by the Subodh Rabidas is that on 18.06.2026 at 7:30 pm he was sitting with his family at his darwaza and at that time Nagiana Nat, Chaneshwar Nat, Sadhu Nat, Chandan Nat, Suraj Nat came there in and intoxicated state with iron rod, lathi and bhala and started to abuse him. On being forbade Nagina Nat with an iron rod and Chaneshwar Nat and Sadhu Nat with lathi started to assault him indiscriminately causing head injuries and he started to bleed. When his wife intervened she was assaulted by fasuli by Chandan Nat and Suraj Nat with a sword started to abuse and assault. They also misbehave with her and she was exposed. Then, Rekha Devi and Sarchaniya Devi assaulted the wife of the informant by lathi danda and snatched jitiya.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners has submitted that petitioners have not earlier moved their bail petition either before this court or before the Hon'ble

Court. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent. Petitioners are innocent and have falsely been implicated in this case. All sections are bailable except 74, 109 and 303(2) of BNS. Prayer is made to enlarge the petitioners on bail.

On the other hand the learned Addl. P.P. for the State vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.

Heard and perused the record. During the course of hearing the informant was in attendance and he submitted that the case has been compromised. The case diary vide para 42 also reveals that the case has been compromised. He also stated that nobody sustained serious injuries. The injury report has still not been received. The allegation is omnibus. As per para 3 of the bail petition there is no criminal antecedent of the petitioner.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, it is ordered that in the event of their arrest or surrender within four weeks from this order, above named accused-petitioners shall be directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand)** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482 of the BNSS. Accordingly, this anticipatory bail application is hereby disposed off.
