Anticipatory Bail Petition Under Section 482 of BNSS

ORDER

This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Amit Sahgal @ Vikas Kumar 2. Nitish Kumar 3. Vishal Kumar @ Gop ji**, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with **Dhanarua P.S. Case No.423/2026** for offence punishable **U/ss 115(2), 126(2), 109(1), 303(2), 351(2), 352 of BNS**, which is pending in the court of the SDJM, Masaurhi is being pressed and heard today.

The case of prosecution on the basis of written information given by Uday Kumar is that on 29.06.2026 at 8:30 pm while he was returning home from market then Vikash Kumar called upon him and started to talk. In the meantime Amit Sahgal, Vishal Kumar, Nitish Kumar (all petitioners) started to assault him by rod, khanti and butt of pistol causing injuries upon head and hand and he sustained hard all over the body. On shout, his son Suman Kumar and nephew Rajnikant Bharti came for his rescue then this were also assaulted. One Babita Devi was also assaulted and his golden mangalsutra was snatched.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners have submitted that petitioners have not earlier moved their bail petition either before this court or before the Hon'ble Court. Petitioners have no previous criminal antecedent as mentioned in bail application. Petitioner is innocent and has falsely been implicated in this case. Prayer has been made to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

On the other hand the learned Addl. P.P. for the State vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner.

Heard and perused the case diary. Para 16 of the case diary shows the injury report of Uday Kumar has lacerated wound in left hand ring finger, abrasion and contusion wound on frontal region of scalp and swelling and tenderness in left thigh. The injury is simple in nature. The supervisory authority has found the case true against Vikas Kumar. The supervisory authority has found the case true u/s 115(2), 126(2), 109(1), 303(2), 351(2), 352 of BNS against Vishal Kumar and petitioner no. 1 Amit Sahgal whereas petitioner no. 2 and 3, some more investigation was required regarding the complicity. Para 24 of the case diary reveals that the petitioner no. 1 Amit Sahgal has got one criminal antecedent whereas there is no mention of criminal antecedent against the other petitioners. Considering the decision, this is an apt case for grant of anticipatory bail.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, it is ordered that in the event of his their arrest or surrender within four weeks from this order, abovenamed accused-petitioners shall be directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand)** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482 & 484 of the BNSS. Accordingly, this anticipatory bail application is hereby disposed off.
