Anticipatory Bail Petition Under Section 482 & 484 of BNSS

ORDER

This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1.Anita Devi 2. Arti Devi 3. Sudama Singh 4. Manish Kumar 5. Prem Kumar**, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with **Masaurhi P.S. Case No. 580/2026** for offence punishable **U/ss 126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109(1), 352, 3(5) of the BNS**, which is pending in the court of the SDJM, Masaurhi is being pressed and heard today.

The case of prosecution on the basis of written information given by Kanti Devi is that on 11.06.2026 at around 4 pm, Sudama Singh, Anita Devi, Manish Kumar, Prem Kumar, Arti Devi came at her residence with iron rod and sticks in their hands and attacked his wife Kanti Devi due to which his wife suffered fracture of the leg and she also sustained head injuries and fell down. She became unconscious and in that state, the accused persons snatched her golden mangalsutra from her neck and ear rings. Manish had pistol in his hand and he hit the informant by the butt of the pistol on the backside. He also suffered injuries on his back.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners has submitted that petitioners have not earlier moved their bail petition either before this court or before the Hon'ble Court. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent. Petitioners are innocent and have falsely been implicated in this case. Petitioners and informant are gotiya to each other. In the fardbeyan, it has been stated that the incident is on 11.06.2026 whereas the application was

given at PS on 09.07.2026. No reason has been assigned for delay in lodging the FIR. There is no specific allegation against the petitioners. Prayer is made to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

On the other hand the learned Addl. P.P. for the State vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.

Heard and perused the record. The witnesses in para 6, 24, 25 have supported the prosecution version but they have stated about the omnibus allegation upon the petitioners. Para 35 of the case diary reveals that the informant was asked for the papers regarding his treatment, they said that they got themselves treated in the private hospital and would give the relevant papers at the police station but the case diary further reveals that no such papers were submitted at the police station.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, it is ordered that in the event of their arrest or surrender within four weeks from this order, above named accused-petitioners shall be directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand)** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482 of the BNSS. Accordingly, this anticipatory bail application is hereby disposed off.
