Anticipatory Bail Petition Under Section 482 & 484 of BNSS

ORDER

This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Smt. Nikki Devi 2. Sri Hira Ram @ Hiralal**, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with **Dhanarua P.S. Case No. 411/2026** for offence punishable **U/ss 115(2), 126(2), 118(1), 3(5) of BNS**, which is pending in the court of the S.D.J.M., Masaurhi is being pressed and heard today.

The case of prosecution on the basis of written information given by Raj Kumar is that on 21.06.26, at 8:30 pm, his co-villagers was assaulting his step mother and at that time he was passing by from there and tried to rescue her. Thereafter, Hira with a sword in his hand attacked him on the head but he sustained hurt on the head and hand causing serious injuries. At that time, Nikki Devi, wife of Hira Ram struck him with iron rod and he fell down at that place. On shout, persons gathered and he submitted that there was no previous enmity with him.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners have submitted that petitioners have not earlier moved their bail petition either before this court or before the Hon'ble Court. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para -2 of the bail petition. Petitioners are innocent and have falsely been implicated in this case. All sections are bailable except 118(1) BNSS. There is no direct allegation against these petitioners. Prayer is made to enlarge the petitioners on bail.

On the other hand the learned Addl. P.P. for the State vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.

Heard and perused the case diary. It appears from para 33 of the case diary that notice u/s 33(3) BNS was served upon the petitioners. The injury report of Raj Kumar is laceration below index and middle fingers and laceration on right parietal skull and abrasion on left fore arm. The nature of injury was opined to be to be simple. However, opinion was reserved for NCCT (PMCH). Para 27 of the case diary reveals that the victim was questioned by the IO upon which he stated that he was referred to PMCH but he did not get himself treated at PMCH rather he recovered from the medicines given by the Doctor of Dhanarua hospital. This application of Raj Kumar is enclosed with the case diary. As per para 2 of the bail petition, there is no criminal antecedents of the petitioners.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case this is an apt case for giving the privilege of anticipatory bail, it is accordingly ordered that in the event of their arrest or surrender within four weeks from this order, abovenamed accused-petitioners shall be directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand)** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482 of the BNSS. Accordingly, this anticipatory bail application is hereby disposed off.
