ORDER

This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner namely **Niranjan Kumar**, who is apprehending to his arrest in connection with **Masaurhi P.S. Case No. 471/2025** for offence punishable **U/s 191(2), 190, 126(2), 115(2), 109, 74, 303, 352 of BNS** which is pending in the court of the SDJM, Masaurhi, is being pressed today and heard.

The case of prosecution on the basis of written information given by the Prabiya Devi is that on 10.06.2025 at about 03:15 P.M. she was at her home. When her husband came to home then Sushma Kumari, Krishna Prasad, Shiv Narain Prasad, Ram Dev Prasad, Vikash Kumar, Niranjan Kumar (Petitioner) and five others restrained her husband with an intention to kill. Niranjan Kumar (petitioner) with an iron rod attacked her husband, Dinesh Kumar on the head by iron rod causing head injuries. When she intercepted then Sushma Kumari assaulted her causing head injury and Kamlesh Kumar tried to outrage her modesty. They damaged the household articles worth Rs. 25,000/-. It is further alleged that Krishna Prasad snatched Rs. 15,000/- from his pocket.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of petitioners has submitted that petitioner has never moved earlier any bail petition either anticipatory or regular before this Court or before the Hon'ble Court. Petitioner got no criminal antecedent. Petitioner is quite innocent has committed no offence and has been falsely and wrongly implicated in this case. The petitioner and informant are own gotiya and petitioner and husband of

informant are own cousin(brother). That the allegation alleged u/s 126(2), 115(2), 109, 303(1), 352, 3(5) BNS in which all the sections areailable except 303(2), 74, 109(1) BNS which is super addition to make the case nonailable and serious in nature. There is case and counter case between the parties. It has been prayed to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

On the other hand the learned Addl. P.P. for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners abovenamed.

Heard both sides and perused the case record as well as the case diary. There is no criminal antecenet against the petitioner as per para-3 of the bail petition. There is direct allegation upon the petitioner of having caused head injury to Dinesh Kumar. The final injury report of Dinesh Kumar shows fracture line seen in the left frontal bone, hyper density seen in the bilateral ethmoidal sinus and frontal sinus collection hematoma. The nature of injury is greivous caused by hard and blunt substance.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, and grievous injury on the vital part of the body, I am not inclined to enlarge petitioner on anticipatory bail, hence his prayer for anticipatory bail is hereby **Rejected**. Accordingly, aforesaid bail petition is hereby disposed off.
