17.04.2026	1. This anticipatory bail application filed on 26.02.2026, on behalf of the petitioner, namely, Md. Dilsher, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Complaint Case no. 2253/2025, registered for the offence u/s. 85, 115(2) of B.N.S. is put up for hearing. 2. Heard Ms. Zeba Parween, learned counsel for the petitioner as well as Sri A.K.Tiwary, learned P.P. appearing for the State assisted by Sri Jayhind Kumar, learned counsel for the complainant. 3. The complaint petition filed by the complainant, Savana Khatoon, in brief, is that her marriage with accused Md. Dilsher was solemnized on 14.08.2023 according to Muslim rituals and customs. The complainant alleges that in her matrimonial house, she was subjected to cruelty by her husband and other in-laws when her parents were unable to fulfill their demand of Rs. 3,50,000/- lakh as dowry. Helplessly, the complainant filed case number 198/25 at the Police Pariwar Paramarsh Kendra, Purnea but no settlement could be reached between the two parties. 4. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is innocent and he is the husband of the complainant. It has been further submitted that the petitioner is ready to keep the complainant as his wife with full dignity and honour. The	

Contd. 17.04.2026	petitioner bears clean antecedent. So, prayed for anticipatory bail. On the other hand, learned P.P. has opposed the prayer for bail. 5. I have heard the rival submission of both parties and perused the original case record. From perusal of the same, it appears that petitioner is the husband of the complainant. On 24.03.2026, the matter was sent to the Mediation Centre, Purnea to restore the marital relationship of the husband and wife, but the result of reconciliation through mediation was unsuccessful. The complainant does not appear in court today despite calls, while the petitioner appears in court with his counsel. It seems that the complainant does not want to live with her husband because of her husband's conduct and cruel attitude towards her. On the other hand, the petitioner is ready to keep the complainant as his wife with dignity and honour. It has been submitted on behalf of learned P.P. that the complainant is facing financial crisis, hence being her husband, the petitioner should give her Rs. 2,000/- every month for her maintenance. In this regard, the learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is ready to pay Rs. 2,000/- per month to the complainant for her maintenance. In addition to that alleged sections are not punishable with more than seven years of imprisonment, hence, law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Arnesh Kumar Vrs. State of Bihar (2014)8 SCC 273 and Satyendra Kumar Antil Vs. C.B.I. is squarely applicable to the facts of this case. 6. Under the facts and circumstances of the case, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner, Md. Dilsher is allowed. He, in the event of surrender within a fortnight from the date of receipt of this order before the Court below or arrest, shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each, subject to the
