12.06.2026	1. This anticipatory bail petition filed on 22.04.2026, on behalf of the petitioner, namely, Md. Soban, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Complaint Case No. 2891/2024 registered for the offence u/s. 85 of BNS is put up for hearing. 2. Heard Sri Jawaaid Akhtar, the learned counsel for the petitioner and Sri Uday Keshri, the learned P.P. I/c appearing for the State. 3. The complaint case filed by complainant Nadia Abrar, in brief, is that her marriage with Md. Soban took place on 11.06.2019. It has been alleged that in her matrimonial house, she was subjected to cruelty by her husband and other in-laws when her parents were unable to provide the items demanded as dowry by the accused persons. 4. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner caught his wife (complainant) in an objectionable state and decided to refuse her. He is ready to make an one time settlement with her. So, prayed for anticipatory bail. On the other hand, learned P.P. I/c assisted by learned counsel for the complainant has opposed the prayer of bail of the petitioner.	

Contd./ 12.06.2026	5. I have heard the rival submission of both parties and perused the original case record. From perusal of the same, it appears that petitioner is the husband of the complainant. On 08.05.2026, the matter was sent to the Mediation Centre, Purnea to restore the marital relationship of the husband and wife, but the result of reconciliation through mediation was unsuccessful. The complainant does not appear in court today despite calls, while the petitioner appears in court with his counsel. It seems that the complainant does not want to live with her husband because of her husband's conduct and cruel attitude towards her. It has been submitted by learned P.P. I/c that the complainant is facing financial crisis, hence being her husband, the petitioner should give her Rs. 2,500/- every month for her maintenance. In this regard, the learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is ready to pay Rs. 2,500/- per month to the complainant for her maintenance until any settlement is reached between them. In addition to that alleged sections are not punishable with more than seven years of imprisonment, hence, law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Arnesh Kumar Vrs. State of Bihar (2014)8 SCC 273 and Satyendra Kumar Antil Vs. C.B.I. is squarely applicable to the facts of this case. 6. Under the facts and circumstances of the case, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner, Md. Soban is allowed. He, in the event of surrender within a fortnight from the date of receipt of this order before the Court below or arrest, shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each, subject to the conditions as laid down u/s. 482 BNSS and subject to condition that the petitioner
