03.06.2026	1. This bail application filed on 20.05.2026, on behalf of the petitioner, namely, Vikas Kumar, who is in judicial custody since 16.03.2026 in connection with Kasba P.S. Case No. 88/2026 registered for the offence u/s. 137(2), 87, 96, 3(5) of BNS is put up for hearing. 2. Heard Sri Ghanshyam Pd. Bishwas, learned counsel for the petitioner as well as Sri Uday Keshri, learned P.P. I/c appearing for the State. 3. The prosecution case, in brief, is that on 02.03.2026, at around 11 a.m., Vikas Kumar kidnapped informant's minor daughter, aged about 16 years and took her with him and went somewhere. Co-accused Pankaj Kumar supported Vikas Kumar in this kidnapping incident. At the time of kidnapping informant's daughter, Vikas Kumar also took away a gold chain weighing one Bhar and Rs. 1,000/- in cash from informant's house. 4. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner has a criminal antecedent and he is accused in Kasba P.S. Case No. 402/25. He has further submitted that because of the love affairs between the victim and the petitioner, the victim went to Delhi with Vikas Kumar of her own free will. No one kidnapped her. He has further submitted that the	

Contd. 03.06.2026	petitioner surrendered before the police and remanded in this case on 16.03.2026. Since then he is in judicial custody. So, prayed for bail. On the other hand, learned P.P. I/c has opposed the prayer of bail of the petitioner. 5. I have heard the rival submission of both parties and perused the L.C.R. and case diary. From perusal of the same it appears that it is a case of kidnapping of minor daughter of the informant, but the alleged victim in her statement recorded u/s. 183 of BNSS has specifically stated that she has a love affair with Vikas Kumar (petitioner). As soon as her marriage was fixed by her parents somewhere else, she left her house without informing anybody and went to Delhi with Vikas Kumar of her own free will. No one had kidnapped her. The victim has not said anything adverse about the petitioner or any other person in her statement. 6. Considering the above facts and the period of custody of the petitioner, the prayer for bail of the petitioner namely Vikas Kumar is allowed. The petitioner is directed to be enlarged on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to condition that one of the bailors should be a close relative of the petitioner.
