This anticipatory bail petition filed on 22.05.2026, on behalf of the petitioners, namely, (1) Rajendra Sah, (2) Asari Devi, (3) Karan Sah, (4) Lakshman Sah, (5) Radha Kumari, (6) Dhiren Sah, (7) Geeta Devi, (8) Rakhi Devi, (9) Maya Devi and (10) Uma Devi, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Baisi P.S. Case no.- 132/2026 registered for the offence u/s. 191(2), 126(2), 115(2), 109, 74, 303(2), 352, 351(2) of BNS is put up for hearing. 2. Heard Sri Pritam Kumar Bharti, learned counsel for the petitioners and Sri Uday Keshri, learned P.P. I/c appearing for the State. 3. The prosecution case, in brief, is that on 04.04.2026, at around 3 p.m., informant's son Ravi Kumar went to Badal's house to ask for his outstanding amount of Rs 10,000/-, when all the named accused abused and assaulted him. When the informant reached there to pacify the fight, all the accused including the petitioners also assaulted her and injured her head. 4. The learned counsel for the petitioners and the informant are	

Contd./ 03.06.2026	residents of same village and they are close relatives. Because of rivalry and land dispute, the present case has been lodged by the informant against the petitioners. It has been further submitted that the present case is the counter blast of Baisi P.S. Case No. 131/2026. It has been further submitted that all allegations are omnibus and general in nature. No specific overt act has been attributed against the petitioners. The petitioners have clean antecedent. So, prayed for anticipatory bail. On the other hand, learned P.P. I/c has opposed the prayer of bail of the petitioners. 5. I have heard the rival submission of both parties and perused the case record, case diary and injury reports of the informant and her son. From perusal of the same, it appears that on the day of the incident, the accused persons assaulted the informant's son over the dispute regarding the outstanding amount, when he went to their house to demand his outstanding amount of Rs. 10,000/- from them. When the informant went to rescue her son, accused persons also assaulted her due to which both of them sustained injuries on their respective persons including the head. The nature of injury of the informant and her son shows simple caused by hard and blunt substance. It also appears that there is no specific overt act against the petitioners rather it is omnibus and general in nature. Land dispute is an admitted fact and there is case and counter case between the parties. Both parties are residents of same locality. Allegation for the offence u/s. 74 and 303(2) of BNS seems to be ornamental because none of the witnesses have supported it. 6. Under the facts and circumstances as discussed above, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners, namely, Rajendra Sah, Asari Devi, Karan Sah, Lakshman Sah, Radha Kumari, Dhiren Sah, Geeta Devi, Rakhi Devi, Maya Devi and Uma Devi is allowed.
