This bail application filed on 30.05.2026, on behalf of the petitioner, namely, Kanhaiya Jhunjunwala @ Kanhaiya Kumar Jhunjunwala, who is in judicial custody since 06.02.2026 in connection with Supplementary Kasba P.S. Case no. 43/2024 registered for the offence u/s. 406, 420, 379, 411 of IPC is put up for hearing. 2. Heard Sri Rajeev Kumar Karn, learned counsel for the petitioner as well as Sri Uday Keshri, learned P.P. I/c appearing for the State. 3. On the fardbayan of informant Sunita Gupta, the prosecution case, in brief, is that on 16.2.2024 at 3 P.M., Informant loaded 367 pieces Excide Batteries to the tune of Rs. 9,34,476/- on Pick-up vehicle bearing Registration No.BR-02GC/6443 from Garhbanaili godown through owner of Bihar Transporter owner, namely, Sanjay Sah for delivery in Khagaria and Patna but driver of the said pick-up Van, namely, Dhiraj Kumar and owner of the pick-up van, namely, Nirajan Sharma did not get deliver the aforesaid battery to concern persons at Khagaria and Patna. It is alleged that the FIR named accused persons in furtherance of their common intention of committed breach of trust and forgery of 367 pieces of batteries. 4. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that apart from this case, the petitioner is accused in two other criminal	

Contd. 15.06.2026	cases. He has further submitted that the petitioner has no concern with the stolen articles. There is no material against the petitioner except the confessional statement of co-accused. The petitioner is in judicial custody since 06.02.2026 and charge sheet has been submitted in this case. So, prayed for bail. On the other hand, learned P.P. I/c has opposed the prayer of bail of the petitioner. 5. I have heard the rival submission of both the parties and perused the L.C.R. and case diary. From perusal of the same, it appears that the petitioner is not named in the FIR. In this case, the petitioner has been arrayed as an accused based on the confessional statement of co-accused Pintu Kumar. Although this case concerns the theft of 376 Exide batteries and during investigation, Patna police recovered the said batteries from the pick-up van bearing Registration No.BR-02GC/6443 against which Patna Chowk P.S. Case No.74 of 2024 was lodged. Although two other cases are also registered against the petitioner, but in this case investigation of the case has been completed and charge sheet filed against the petitioner who is in judicial custody since 06.02.2026. As such there is no chance of influencing witnesses or tampering with the evidence. It also appears that some other co-accused persons have already been granted bail by this court vide order dated 04.06.2024, 02.07.2024 and 14.10.2025 passed in B.P. No.586 of 2024, B.P. No.764 of 2024 and B.P. No. 1166 of 2025 respectively, and case of the petitioner is more or less stands on similar footing. 6. Under the facts and circumstances as discussed above and considering the period of detention of the petitioner, the prayer for bail of the petitioner, Kanhaiya Jhunjhunwala @ Kanhaiya Kumar Jhunjhunwala is allowed and he is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail-bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to conditions that (1) one of the bailors should be a close
