18.03.2026 This is an application for grant of anticipatory bail filed on behalf of accused / petitioner named above who apprehends his arrest in connection with Akorhigola P.S. Case No. 17/20, U/s 147, 148, 149, 341, 323, 324, 307, 379, 504, 506 of IPC.

The Ld. Counsel appearing on behalf of petitioner submits that petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence. Ld. Counsel for the petitioner further submits that the prosecution story in brief is that on 28.01.2020 at about 12 PM the informant allegedly went to plough his agricultural land. It is alleged that due to non-availability of a boring motor, he went along with laborers to make arrangement for starting water for agricultural work at that time, as per the FIR, about 40 named accused persons along with 40 unknown persons allegedly arrived at the place of occurrence and objected to the agricultural work, stating that they would not allow the same. It is further alleged that thereafter a quarrel ensued between the parties and during the course of the altercation, stone pelting took place. The informant claims that due to the pelting of stones he lay down on the ground as sustained injury on his head. It has further been alleged that during the said occurrence, a sum of Rs. 50,000/- was stolen from his pocket and his gold chain was snatched. The informant claims that he somehow managed to escape from the place of occurrence.

Ld. Counsel further submits that the petitioner is a law-abiding citizen having no criminal antecedent and having deep roots in the society. The petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated in the present case due to previous land dispute and village rivalry. There is no specific overt act attributed against the petitioner in the entire FIR. The allegations are omnibus and general in nature. The FIR does not disclose that the petitioner specifically pelted any stone or caused any injury to the informant. Ld. Counsel further submits that a

Cont..... total of 37 co-accused in this case have been granted anticipatory bail by Ld. ADJ-III, vide ABP No. 284/2020 dated 24.08.2020, that again co-accused Ayodhya Mahto and Bihari Ram have been granted anticipatory bail by Ld. ADJ-III, Sasaram vide ABP No. 391/2020 and 664/2025 dated 24.08.2020 and 06.06.2025 respectively. furnish the sureties to the satisfaction of court. The Ld. Counsel for the petitioner prays to release the petitioner on bail.

The learned APP has vehemently opposed the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail.

Heard and perused the record. On perusal of the record, I find that this case is registered U/s 147, 148, 149, 341, 323, 324, 307, 379, 504, 506 of IPC. It further reveals that there is no specific allegation against the petitioner, there is land dispute between the parties for which the alleged offence has occurred and near about 42 person were made accused by the informant with 40-50 unknown persons. It further reveals that all the other co-accused persons are enjoying the privilege of anticipatory bail vide ABP No. 284/2020 and ABP No. 391/2020 dated 24.08.2020 and ABP 664 dated 06.06.2025 granted by this court. The bail grounds of this petitioner are same and similar footing.

Considering the facts and circumstances of the case discussed, this court is inclined to enlarge the petitioner on anticipatory bail. Accordingly petitioners prayer for grant of anticipatory bail is hereby **allowed** on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the Ld. Court below on his arrest or surrender within 15 days from the date of this order.
