26.05.2026	An anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of accused petitioners namely (1) Arvind Singh (2) Abhay Pratap Singh (3) Golu Kumar who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Sanjhauli P.S. Case no. 04/2026, registered u/s 126(2), 115(2), 76, 352, 351(2), 351(3), 329(4), 3(5) of the BNS. Case has been heard and was posted for an order today. Mr. Deepak Kumar, Ld. counsel on behalf of accused appeared and submitted that applicant is innocent and have not committed any offence and they have falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that the case has been compromised between the parties. The petitioners are ready to abide all the conditions of bail. Hence their application for anticipatory bail be allowed. Ld. APP appearing on behalf of State has opposed the anticipatory bail application. He argued that matter of an application has been registered under sections 126(2), 115(2), 76, 352, 351(2), 351(3), 329(4), 3(5) of the BNS. Hence the instant anticipatory bail application be rejected. Perused the record of case and material available on record. From perusal it transpires that the instant case has been registered on the written application of informant namely Archana Kumari. The instant case has been filed against the petitioners and three others for the offence punishable under sections 126(2), 115(2), 76, 352, 351(2), 351(3), 329(4), 3(5) of the BNS.
