	23.04.2026	This bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely (1) Mukesh Mandal S/o Sitaram Mandal, (2) Laltu @ Lalto Mandal S/o Sitaram Mandal and (3) Kari Mandal S/o Munilal Mandal are in custody since 20.03.2026 in connection with Darhar P.S. Case No. 23/2026 registered under Sections 191(2), 191(3), 126(2), 115(2), 109, 352, 351(2) (3) of BNS, 2023. 2. Heard the arguments of the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned P.P. for the State. 3. It is submitted by the learned counsel for the accused petitioners that petitioners are in custody since 20.03.2026 having clean past antecedent. It is further submitted that petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence and they have falsely been implicated in this case due to dirty village party politics and land dispute. It is further submitted that Section 109 of BNS, 2023 is added to make the case graver and non-bailable. It is further submitted that petitioners men of means and there is no chance of their	

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absconding in this case and they are ready to furnish sound sureties to the full satisfaction of the court. Upon these grounds, the learned counsel prays to grant bail to the petitioners.

4. On the other hand, the learned P.P. has opposed the prayer of bail.

5. Rival submissions considered, Record perused.

6. The prosecution case as emerges from the written report of informant Baleshwar Yadav is that on 19.03.2026 at about 02:00 O'clock when he went to his field then saw some persons harvesting crop when he objected then the accused persons namely Sitaram Mandal, Mukesh Mandal, Laltu Mandal, Sonu Mandal, Sukul Ji Mandal, Vikash Mandal, Kari Mandal, Vinod Mandal, Shyam Lal Mandal, Jayo Mandal assaulted with filthy words and the accused persons armed with lathi, danda and farsa assaulted on his head by lathi and farsa due to which his head got lacerated. When his brother Vakil Yadav and nephew Ashok Yadav came to rescue him then they were also assaulted by the accused persons due to which they became unconscious. When the nearby villagers came there then the accused persons fled away from there.

7. The petitioners are in custody since 20.03.2026 with clean past antecedent as mentioned in para 42 of the case diary. The injury suffered by the injured persons are simple in nature. The injured persons have already been discharged from the Hospital.

8. Considering the totality of the facts and circumstances, a case to grant bail to the petitioners accused namely (1) Mukesh Mandal, (2) Laltu @ Lalto Mandal and (3) Kari Mandal is made out. Resultantly the

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prayer for bail is **allowed**. The petitioners be released on bail subject to their furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate where the case is presently pending further subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 480(3) of the BNSS.
