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22.06.2026 Heard Sri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioner and learned I/C - P.P for the State on the anticipatory bail petition of accused/petitioner, who apprehends his arrest in connection with Kalyanpur P.S Case No. 67 of 2026 registered under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 109, 190, 191(2), 191(3), 351(2), 351(3), 352, 324(4), 309(4), 74, 132 of the B.N.S.

As per F.I.R, the informant has got secret information that accused of Kalyanpur P.S. Case No. 346 of 2025 namely Gunjan Singh had come at his house and on this information the informant alongwith other police personnel arrived at his house for raid and seeing the police party the said Gunjan Kumar Singh from his roof raised alarm against the police saying MARO-MARO and also abused them and taking advantage of darkness the said Gunjan Kumar succeeded in fleeing away thereafter the family members of Gunjan Singh and other unsocial

elements attacked upon the police party, as a result of which members of police team became injured. It is further alleged that the accused persons also misbehaved with the ladies police personnel and they created obstruction in discharging the official duty and they also damaged the police vehicle.

The Ld. Counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submitted that petitioner is an innocent person and he has committed no offence and he has falsely been implicated in this case due to village politics. Further submitted that there is no specific allegation of overt act alleged against the petitioner and the sections involved in the case is also not attracted against the petitioner. Ld. Counsel also submitted that informant and other police staff have no concern with the petitioner and they never went to the house of the petitioner so how they identified the petitioner in the alleged mob. Ld. Counsel lastly submitted that the petitioner has no criminal antecedent so, petitioner may be given the benefit of anticipatory bail.

The Ld. P.P has vehemently opposed the prayer of anticipatory bail.

On perusal of the record, it appears that F.I.R has been registered under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 109, 190, 191(2), 191(3), 351(2), 351(3), 352, 324(4), 309(4), 74, 132 of the B.N.S. Further it appears that co-accused Jay Prakash Singh, who is brother of main accused Gunjan

Singh has already been granted anticipatory bail by the Hon'ble High Court vide order dated 26.05.2026 passed in Criminal Miscellaneous No. 35812 of 2026 and co-accused Dharamjit Kumar Singh, who has two criminal antecedent has already been granted anticipatory bail by the Hon'ble High Court vide order dated 29.04.2026 passed in Criminal Miscellaneous No. 28449 of 2026. Further petitioner claims to have no criminal antecedent and further allegation against him is only trying to assault the member of raiding team.

Considering the aforementioned facts, let the anticipatory bail petition of petitioner named above be allowed and it is directed that in the event of his arrest or surrender before the court below he shall be released on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
