ORDER

1. The present petition has been filed by the accused petitioners, namely Amit Kumar seeking anticipatory bail as he has been in custody since 08.05.2026 in connection with Hasanpur P.S. Case No. 156 of 2025, registered under Sections 190, 191(2), 121(1), 121(2), 126(2), 132, 109, 324(5), 352(2), and 352(3) of the B.N.S.
2. Briefly stated, the case of the prosecution is that on 27.08.2025 at about 8:45 A.M., the Officer-in-Charge of Hasanpur Police Station received information that due to the death of the injured in Hasanpur PS Case No. 148 of 2025, namely, Sanju Devi, villagers had blocked the road at Medo Chowk and were creating disturbance by damaging vehicles. On receiving the information, the police party reached Medo Chowk and found that the villagers had placed a dead body on the road and obstructed traffic, causing long traffic congestion and inconvenience to the public. When the police tried to persuade them to remove the blockade, the mob became aggressive and attacked the police personnel and government vehicle. It is alleged that the mob damaged the police vehicle and overturned it on the roadside, and also assaulted police officials with intention to kill, causing injuries to them. During inquiry and on the basis of local information, video footage and identification by the chowkidar, the accused persons were identified as Amit Kumar, Gulab Yadav, Umesh Yadav, Nitish Kumar Yadav, Nitish Kumar, Abhishek Kumar, Lal Babu @ Mani, Sujit Kumar, Neeraj Kumar, Lal Mohan, Sintu Kumar, Vipin Kumar and Subhash Kumar Yadav along with 12-15 unknown persons. It is alleged that the accused persons obstructed government work, attacked police officials, and damaged the government vehicle during the occurrence.
3. Heard Sri. Krishna Kumar, Ld. Counsel for the accused petitioner and Sri Shiv Shankar Yadav, Ld. APP. for the State.
4. Ld. Counsel for the accused petitioner has submitted that earlier petitioner had filed anticipatory bail petition namely, ABP No. 223 of 2026 which has been withdrawn. The petitioner was arrested by police on 07.05.2026 and his regular bail petition has been rejected on 08.05.2026. Ld. Counsel further submits that the petitioner has no criminal antecedents. Petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence and

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he has been falsely implicated in this case. No specific allegation has been made against the petitioner. It is further submitted that earlier co-accused have been granted regular and anticipatory bail. The petitioner undertakes to abide by all terms and conditions as may be imposed by the Court and to file sureties.

5. On the other hand Ld. APP. on behalf of state opposed the prayer for bail.
6. Perusal of the records shows that the present case has been instituted against the accused including the present petitioners under Sections 190, 191(2), 121(1), 121(2), 126(2), 132, 109, 324(5), 352(2), and 352(3) of the B.N.S. on the allegation that they assaulted police party and damaged vehicle and caused obstruction in the discharge of public duty. Perusal of the case diary reveals the injuries of the injured as bruises on shoulder which have been opined as simple. Mostly all the witnesses appear to be official witnesses and hence likelihood of them being influenced by the accused appear to be remote. Furthermore, the Hon'ble High Court vide order dated 17.02.2026 passed in Criminal Miscellaneous No. 5458 of 2026 granted anticipatory bail to the co-accused namely Abhishek Kumar, Neeraj Kumar Niranjana and Umesh Yadav facing exactly the same allegation as that of the present petitioner. Other co-accused has been granted regular bail vide order dated 03.01.2026 passed in BP No. 390 of 2025.
7. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case including the omnibus allegation against the present petitioners and the fact that similarly, situated co-accused have been granted anticipatory bail by the Honourable High Court, it appears that it would be appropriate to grant bail to the present petitioner.
8. Accordingly, the petitioners, namely Amit Kumar is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the Court of the Ld. Magistrate concerned in connection with Hasanpur PS Case No. 156 of 2025, subject to the conditions mentioned in Section 480(3) of BNSS.
9. Let a copy of this order along with the LCR be sent to the Court of the Ld. Magistrate concerned.
