**ORDER**

The present petitions have been filed on behalf of the accused petitioners namely **1. Ritik Kumar 2. Krishna Kumar** in connection with Hasanpur P.S. Case No. 94 of 2026 under Sections- 309(4) of B.N.S.

As per the F.I.R., the prosecution story, in brief, is as follows-

The informant Dheeraj Kumar has stated in his application that on 31.06.2026 at about 06:20 PM, he was returning his village Jagannathpur from Singhiya. Then two miscreants stopped him at gunpoint near Phulhara Dhala. They assaulted him and forcibly snatched two mobile phones, a grey coloured splendor motorcycle and Rs. 8000. After committing robbery, they fled towards Kelhua Ghat. In the background of aforesaid incident, the instant case has been lodged.

Ld. Counsel for the accused petitioners has submitted that no anticipatory or regular bail petitions have ever been moved or pending or have been disposed of either by the Ld. Court of DASJ Rosera, or by the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. The petitioners have got no criminal antecedents. The petitioners are in custody since 21.04.2026. The petitioners are innocent and committed no offence. No any looted articles have been recovered from the possession of the petitioners. The petitioners are ready to abide by the terms and conditions imposed by the learned court. There is no chance of their absconding or tempering with the evidence. Therefore, the bail may be granted to the petitioners.

On the other hand Ld. APP on behalf of state opposed the prayer for bail.

Heard both sides. Perused the case record. This is a typical case of loot in which two unknown miscreants had robbed the motorcycle, mobile handset and Rs. 8000 in cash from the informant. Clearly, the accused petitioners are non-FIR accused whose names came on the surface during the investigation of the case. Para 54 of the case

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diary reveals that the petitioners have no criminal antecedents. During investigation of the case, the police has recovered the stolen motorcycle from the possession of the petitioner Krishna Kumar. In his confessionl statement, this petitioner has admitted his guilt and said that two other miscreants were also involved in aforesaid robbery. This petitioner has divulged the names of Ritik Kumar and Shiv Kumar who were involved in the robbery. Recovery of motorcycle confirms the involvement of the accsed petitioners in the robbery. The investigation is still going on. Therefore, it is not judicious to release the petitioners on bail right now.

Accordingly, the bail petitions of **1. Ritik Kumar 2. Krishna Kumar** stand **rejected**. However, the petitioners may filed fresh bail petitions after submission of charge-sheet.
