State of Bihar vs. Md. Kamaluddin and ors.

17-07-26	Case called out and record produced before me. Record is fixed for evidence. Two accused Md. Kamaluddin and Md. Javed are in attendance along with their Ld. Counsel. Ld. APO for the state is present. Ld. Counsel appearing on behalf of the two accused person submits that both the accused wishes to plead guilty to the offences they are charged with. This court asked the accused persons about the voluntariness of the plea of guilt to which both of them stated that they desire to plead guilty voluntarily without any force, fear, inducement and threat and after fully understanding the consequences of their plea of guilt for the offences committed by them. Upon being satisfied that the accused persons have voluntarily pleaded guilty, their plea of guilt is accepted and they are convicted for the commission of offence punishable u/s 290, 429 of IPC, u/s 11(l) of The Prevention of Cruelty to Animal act, 1960 and u/s 3/4 of The Bihar Preservation and Improvement of Animals Act, 1955. Heard both sides on the point of sentence. Ld. APO has submitted that strict punishment should be given. On the other hand, Ld. Counsel of the convict has submitted that both the accused have voluntarily pleaded guilty. Therefore, any minimum quantum of sentence or fine may be imposed. He further submits that they don't have any criminal antecedent. Upon considering the submissions put forward by the parties and regard being given to the circumstances of the case, including the nature of the offences and the character of the offenders, this court is of the view that the accused persons are remorseful of their act and hence have pleaded guilty voluntarily. Therefore, a lenient view is taken against them and accused namely Md. Kamaluddin and Md. Javed are sentenced to pay: 1. Fine of ₹200 (Two hundred) for the offence u/s 290 IPC and in lieu of fine simple imprisonment of fourteen days, 2. Fine of ₹1000 (One Thousand) for the offence u/s 429 IPC and in lieu of fine simple imprisonment of thirty days,

Cont...	3. Fine of ₹1000 (One Thousand) for the offence u/s ¼ of The Bihar Preservation and Improvement of Animals Act, 1955 and in lieu of fine simple imprisonment of thirty days, 4. Fine of ₹50 (Fifty) for the offence u/s 11(l) of The Prevention of Cruelty to Animal act, 1960 and in lieu of fine simple imprisonment of seven days. Pronounced in open court, SDJM, Shahpur Patori, 17-07-2026	
Later on...	Fine of ₹2,250 on behalf of each accused (total ₹4500) deposited in the Nazarat, Civil Court, Shahpur Patori and a receipt bearing number 20668 dated 17-07-2026 of the payment of the fine is produced in the court. The receipt is kept on record. Thereby, upon finding the fine deposited by both the accused as correct, both the accused are ordered to be released at once. Office Clerk is directed to recall the process issued by the court (if any) and deposit the record in the record room within stipulated period. Accordingly, the case stands disposed of. Pending application (if any) stands disposed in the light of this judgement. O/C is directed to upload the judgment and update the CIS accordingly. SDJM, Shahpur Patori, 17-07-2026
