### ORDER

24.03.2026

The anticipatory bail petition dated 27.02.2026 has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Manoj Kumar Verma, 2. Ghanshyam Kumar, 3. Suraj Kumar, 4. Jyoti Verma, 5. Rani Devi and 6. Govinda Kumar**, in connection with Piprahi, P.S. Case No. 43/2026 registered for the offence u/s 126(2), 115(2), 191(2), 76, 303(2), 352, 351(2) of BNS and the same has been put today for the order.

The prosecution story as per the FIR is that there is a land dispute between the parties in respect of Khesra No. 963, Chek No. 18 ares, 05 decimal. The informant stated that a dispute arose on 15.02.2026 in respect of the same land and the accused persons assaulted the informant and other members of his family with lathi and danda. Hence the case.

 The Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have committed no offence whatsoever as alleged. It is further submitted that the prosecution case as alleged is false, frivolous, baseless and concocted. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent. The petitioners are respectable person of the locality and sound sureties are ready to stand their bailors. It is, therefore, prayed that the petitioner should be allowed anticipatory bail.

The Ld. Special P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail application and stated that the accused persons assaulted the informant and other members of his family with lathi and danda and they have committed the offences U/s 126(2), 115(2), 191(2), 76, 303(2), 352, 351(2) of BNS. Therefore, the anticipatory bail application of the petitioner / accused person should be rejected.

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Heard both the parties and perused the record.

After perusal of the F.I.R it is clear that the case has been instituted U/s 126(2), 115(2), 191(2), 76, 303(2), 352, 351(2) of BNS. From perusal of case record, it appears that no case of cheating is made out against the petitioners. The injury is simple in nature caused by latthi and danda. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent.

Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case this Court is inclined to admit the petitioners to anticipatory bail. It is therefore ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the trial court within four weeks from the date of this order the accused persons / petitioners namely, **1. Manoj Kumar Verma, 2. Ghanshyam Kumar, 3. Suraj Kumar, 4. Jyoti Verma, 5. Rani Devi and 6. Govinda Kumar**, is directed to be released on bail after furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000 (Ten Thousands) with two sureties with condition that they will comply the conditions mentioned under section 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
