ORDER

The anticipatory bail petition dated 11.03.2026 has been filed on behalf of the petitioner namely **Gunjan Singh @ Amitab Gunjan**, in connection with Piprahi P.S. Case No. 53/2026 registered for the offence U/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(2), 74, 109(1), 118(2), 352, 351(2), 351(3), 3(5) of B.N.S & 27 Arms Act and the same has been put today for the order.

The prosecution story in brief is that at 05:00 PM the informant's daughter Sonali Kumari returning after cutting grass then Raja Singh, Virbradharh Singh, Gunjan Singh, Dhananjay Singh, Dilip Singh/ accused persons came and try to harass Sonali Kumari then Bacchu Sah and Mahendra Sah tried to save Sonali Kumari then accused persons assault with "farsa" and try to kill them and they fired. They were also beaten by them. Accordingly, the F.I.R. has been instituted.

The Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that petitioner is innocent and he has committed no offence whatsoever as alleged. It is further submitted that the prosecution case as alleged is false, frivolous, baseless and concocted. That petitioner have falsely implicated in this case due to dirty politics. The allegation against the petitioner is of firing on informant side but there is no injury to anyone from fire arm and the same is clear from the FIR itself. No other specific allegation against the petitioner. It is also submitted that the petitioner is respectable person of the locality and sound sureties are ready to stand his bailors. It is, therefore, prayed that the petitioner be allowed anticipatory bail.

The Ld. Special P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail application and stated that the petitioner has harassed and assaulted and open fire on the informant's daughter Sonali Kumari and other members and they have

committed the offences U/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(2), 74, 109(1), 118(2), 352, 351(2), 351(3), 3(5) of B.N.S. & 27 Arms Act Therefore, the anticipatory bail application of the petitioner / accused person should be rejected.

Heard both the parties and perused the record.

After perusal of the F.I.R it is clear that the case has been instituted U/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(2), 74, 109(1), 118(2), 352, 351(2), 351(3), 3(5) of B.N.S. & 27 Arms Act. From perusal of case record, it appears that the allegation against the petitioner is of firing on informant side but there is no injury to anyone from fire arm and the same is clear from the FIR itself. No other specific allegation against the petitioner. No injury report has been submitted by A.P.P after lapse of a long time. In this case neither date of occurrence nor place of occurrence has been mentioned.

Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case this Court is inclined to admit the petitioner to anticipatory bail. It is therefore ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the trial court within four weeks from the date of this order the accused person /petitioner namely, **Gunjan Singh @ Amitab Gunjan**, is directed to be released on bail after furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000 (Ten Thousands) with two sureties with condition that he shall comply the conditions mentioned under section 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
