ORDER

The anticipatory bail petition dated 11.03.2026 has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Vikram Kumar Ram @ Vikram Ram and 2. Deepak Ram**, in connection with Sheohar, P.S. Case No. 50/2026 registered for the offence u/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 352, 351(2), 351(3), 3(5) of B.N.S and the same has been put today for the order.

The prosecution case in brief is that on 08.02.2026 at 10:30 P.M. informant Mina Devi was in her house then accused persons Vikram Kumar Ram and Deepak Ram entered the house after drinking alcohol. Both the accused persons assaulted the informant with knife and through kick and they were brutally injured the informant. Persons of vicinity came there and take away the informant to Sadar Hospital Sheohar, where she was treated. Accordingly, the F.I.R. has been instituted.

The Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have committed no offence whatsoever as alleged. It is further submitted that the prosecution case as alleged is false, frivolous, baseless and concocted. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent. The time of the incident is stated as 10:30 PM in the FIR, whereas the medical treatment has administered at 10:00 PM. The petitioners are respectable person of the locality and sound sureties are ready to stand their bailors. It is, therefore, prayed that the petitioner should be allowed anticipatory bail.

The Ld. Special P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail application and stated that the accused persons assaulted the informant with knife and kick and they have committed the offences U/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 352, 351(2), 351(3), 3(5) of B.N.S. Therefore, the anticipatory

bail application of the petitioners / accused persons should be rejected.

Heard both the parties and perused the record.

After perusal of the F.I.R it is clear that the case has been instituted U/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 352, 351(2), 351(3), 3(5) of B.N.S. From perusal of FIR, it appears that the time of the incident is stated as 10:30 PM in the FIR, whereas the medical treatment has been administered at 10:00 PM. From the perusal of injury report it appears that no injury by sharp weapon on the body of informant and the informant has stated in the FIR that there is attack on her by knife. Hence either the FIR or the injury report is unworthy. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent.

Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case this Court is inclined to admit the petitioners to anticipatory bail. It is therefore ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the trial court within four weeks from the date of this order the accused persons / petitioners namely, **1. Vikram Kumar Ram @ Vikram Ram and 2. Deepak Ram**, is directed to be released on bail after furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000 (Ten Thousands) with two sureties with condition that they will comply the conditions mentioned under section 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
