ORDER

02.05.2026

The anticipatory bail petition dated 10.04.2026 has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Ramishwar Rai and 2. Mithilesh Devi**, in connection with Shyampur Bhatha P.S. Case No. 76/2026 registered for the offence u/s 137(2), 87, 3(5) of B.N.S and the same has been put today for the order.

The prosecution story as per the FIR is that on 16.03.2026 at 09:00 AM the informant Kamlesh Devi has been informed that her minor daughter Lakshmi Kumari (aged about 15 years) was being abducted by Prince Kumar with intention to marry. Her daughter was seen with the accused Prince Kumar at Muzaffarpur Railway Station at the same time her husband and other family members rushed to the station in search of her daughter but the accused persons fled away with her daughter. CCTV footage installed at the railway station also showed Laxmi Kumari leaving with the accused Prince Kumar. Accordingly, the F.I.R. has been instituted.

The Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have committed no offence whatsoever as alleged. It is further submitted that the case as alleged is false, frivolous, baseless and concocted. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent. It is also submitted that the petitioners are respectable persons of the locality and sound sureties are ready to stand their bailors. It is, therefore, prayed that the petitioners be allowed anticipatory bail.

The Ld. Additional P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail application and stated the petitioners are not innocent and they have

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committed the offence U/s 137(2),87, 3(5) Therefore, the anticipatory bail application of the petitioners should be rejected.

Heard both the parties and perused the record.

After perusal of the F.I.R, it is clear that the case has been instituted u/s 137(2),87, 3(5) of B.N.S. From perusal of the F.I.R., It appears that the petitioners have no criminal antecedent. No name of accused persons in the statement U/s 183 B.N.S.S. The victim Laxmi Kumari is living with her parents.

Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case this Court is inclined to admit the petitioner to anticipatory bail. It is therefore ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the trial court within four weeks from the date of this order the accused persons / petitioners namely, **1. Ramishwar Rai and 2. Mithilesh Devi**, are directed to be released on bail after furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000 (Ten Thousands) with two sureties with condition that they will comply the conditions mentioned under section 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
