ORDER

The anticipatory bail petition dated 21.04.2026 has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **Manoj Kumar**, in connection with Sheohar P.S. Case No. 14/2026 registered for the offence U/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 118(2), 109(1), 352, 3(5) of B.N.S., and the same has been put today for the order.

The prosecution story in brief is that vide on 21.01.2026, the informant with his son were going to Nurse College Sheohar when they reached the petitioner's house at round 6 PM they saw at the petitioner's house at around 6 P.M. the petitioner was swining a knife in his hand on the road. Seeing him swinging the knife the informant and his son Shivam Kumar asked him that why he was swining the knife on the road as anyone can get hurt. The petitioner them started to abuse and pushed the informant and his son and they also assaulted the informant and his son with knife and intention to kill them. Accordingly, the F.I.R. has been instituted.

A The Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that petitioner is innocent and he has committed no offence whatsoever as alleged. It is further submitted that the prosecution case as alleged is false, frivolous, baseless and concocted. That petitioner have been falsely implicated in this case due to dirty politics. No specific allegation against the petitioner. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent. It is also submitted that the petitioner is respectable person of the locality and sound sureties are ready to stand his bailors. It is, therefore, prayed that the petitioner be allowed anticipatory bail.

The Ld. Special P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail application and stated that he has committed the offences U/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 118(2), 109(1), 352, 3(5) of B.N.S. Therefore, the anticipatory bail

application of the petitioner / accused person should be rejected.

Heard both the parties and perused the record.

After perusal of the F.I.R it is clear that the case has been instituted U/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 118(2), 109(1), 352, 3(5) of B.N.S. From perusal of FIR, it appears that no specific allegation against the petitioner. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent and the dispute is trivial in nature.

Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case this Court is inclined to admit the petitioner to anticipatory bail. It is therefore ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the trial court within four weeks from the date of this order the accused person /petitioner namely, **Manoj Kumar**, is directed to be released on bail after furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000 (Ten Thousands) with two sureties with condition that he will comply the conditions mentioned under section 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
