ORDER

06.06.2026

The anticipatory bail petition dated 18.05.2026 has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Sumit Patel and 2. Amit Patel** in connection with Tariyani P.S. Case No. 130/2024 registered for the offence u/s 126(2), 115(2), 303(2), 74, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of B.N.S. and the same has been put today for the order.

The prosecution story in brief is that on 08.05.2026 a scuffle arose between informant and accused persons while they are enjoying orchestra in a marriage ceremony. Further Surendra Shah alleged that Amit Patel and Sumit Patel wrongfully restrained him and assaulted him with an iron rod causing head injuries to his head. When his wife intervened to save him she was also assaulted and her clothes were torn. The accused allegedly snatched a gold chain worth about Rs. 1,00,000 from the informant and another gold chain worth about Rs. 65,000 from his wife. Following the incident both victims were taken to Sadar Hospital, Sheohar for medical treatment. Accordingly, the F.I.R. has been registered.

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The Learned counsel for petitioners submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have committed no offence whatsoever as alleged. It is submitted that the F.I.R. as alleged is false, frivolous, baseless and concocted. The petitioners are quite innocent. The petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent & they deserve anticipatory bail.

The Ld. Additional Special P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail petition and stated that they have committed the offences U/s 126(2), 115(2), 303(2), 74, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of B.N.S. Therefore, the anticipatory bail application of the petitioners should be rejected.

Heard both the parties and perused the record.

After perusal of the F.I.R and case diary, it is clear that the case has

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been instituted u/s 126(2), 115(2), 303(2), 74, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of B.N.S.. From perusal of the F.I.R and case diary, it appears that the petitioners have no criminal antecedent and section 109(1) BNS is not made out because there is no intention to kill anyone and the dispute arose while both the parties enjoying orchestra in marriage ceremony.

Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case this Court is inclined to admit the petitioners to anticipatory bail. It is therefore ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the trial court within four weeks from the date of this order the accused persons / petitioners namely, **1. Sumit Patel and 2. Amit Patel**, are directed to be released on bail after furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000 (Ten Thousands) with two sureties with condition that the petitioners will comply the conditions mentioned under section 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
