

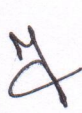

Md. Nassu Alam Vs. State of Bihar

ORDER

08.06.2026

The bail petition dated 20.05.2026 has been filed on behalf of the petitioner namely **Md. Nassu Alam**, who is in judicial custody since 03.02.2026, in connection with Sheohar, P.S. Case No. 28/2026 registered for the offence u/s 310(2) of B.N.S. and the same has been put today for the order.

The prosecution story in brief is that on 29.01.2026 at 12:30 PM the informant was asleep in his house then 6-7 unknown accused persons gained entry by getting the door opened. They snatched his mobile phone and at gunpoint confined him in a room. The accused persons then took the key to the almirah and looted approximately Rs. 18,000-20,000 in cash along with other valuables kept inside. All the accused persons were young men and two of them were armed with firearms. After committing the offence they fled the scene. When the informant raised an alarm the neighbors arrived and found the household articles scattered and the almirah broken and a robbery had been committed. Accordingly, the F.I.R. has been instituted.

 The Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that petitioner is innocent and he has committed no offence whatsoever as alleged. It is further submitted that the prosecution case as alleged is false, frivolous, baseless and concocted. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent. The petitioner is respectable person of the locality and sound sureties are ready to stand his bailors. It is, therefore, prayed that the petitioner should be allowed bail.

The Ld. Special P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail application and stated that he has committed the offences U/s 310(2)

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of B.N.S. Therefore, the bail application of the petitioner / accused person should be rejected.

Heard both the parties and perused the record.

After perusal of the F.I.R it is clear that the case has been instituted U/s 310(2) of B.N.S. From perusal of L.C.R, it appears that the no specific recovery in this case and FIR has been instituted against the unknown accused persons. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent and he is in judicial custody since 03.02.2026.

Thus, considering the facts and circumstances of the case the accused / petitioner **Md. Nassu Alam** is ordered to be released on bail after furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000 (Ten Thousands) with two sureties.
