Shankar Rai & Anrs. Vs. State of Bihar

ORDER

08.06.2026

The anticipatory bail petition dated 01.06.2026 has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Shankar Rai, 2. Deepak Kumar Rai, 3. Sanjay Kumar Rai and 4. Anil Rai**, in connection with Sheohar (Fatehpur) P.S. Case No. 238/2024 registered for the offence u/s 126(2), 115(2), 74, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of B.N.S. and the same has been put today for the order.

The prosecution story in brief is that on 24.08.2026 at 10:00 AM the accused persons namely Shankar Rai, Deepak Kumar Rai, Anil Kumar Rai and Sanjay Rai along with three unknown persons armed with lathis and an iron rod came to the informant's house and started assaulting her. When her husband and other family member intervened to rescue her they were also assaulted with an iron rod, while another attempted to assault the informant's husband with a knife causing an injury to his right hand. The accused also dragged the informant by her hair, threw her to the ground snatched her mangalsutra and assaulted her causing her to lose consciousness. They further removed Rs. 8,500 from her husband's pocket and forcibly brought her minor daughter home from school where she was also assaulted. On hearing the commotion local people gathered following which the accused fled from the spot after threatening to return and kill the victims. Accordingly, the F.I.R. has been instituted.

The Learned counsel for petitioners submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have committed no offence whatsoever as alleged. It is submitted that the F.I.R. as alleged is false, frivolous, baseless and concocted. The petitioners are quite innocent. The petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case. They deserve anticipatory bail.

The Ld. Additional Special P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail petition and stated that they have committed the offences U/s 126(2), 115(2),

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74, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of B.N.S. Therefore, the anticipatory bail application of the petitioners should be rejected.

Heard both the parties and perused the record.

After perusal of the F.I.R, it is clear that the case has been instituted u/s 126(2), 115(2), 74, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of B.N.S.. From perusal of the F.I.R and case diary, it appears that the petitioners have been given benefit of Section 35 of B.N.S.S. by the police and the cognizance has been taken and charge-sheet has been submitted by police in this case.

Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case this Court is inclined to admit the petitioner to anticipatory bail. It is therefore ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the trial court within four weeks from the date of this order the accused persons / petitioners namely, **1. Shankar Rai, 2. Deepak Kumar Rai, 3. Sanjay Kumar Rai and 4. Anil Rai,** are directed to be released on bail after furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000 (Ten Thousands) with two sureties with condition that the petitioners will comply the conditions mentioned under section 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
