ORDER

26.05.2026 Bail petition dated 04.05.2026, filed on behalf of the accused/petitioner Ranjit Singh who is in custody since 27.04.2026 in connection with Shekhopur Sarai P.S. Case No. 165/2025, under Sections- 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 3(5) of BNS and Sec. 3(1)(r), 3(1)(s) and 3(2)(va) of SC/ST Act. pressed today.

Pressing the bail petition, learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that no bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner either before this sessions division or before the Hon'ble High Court and the petitioner has no criminal antecedent. It has been further submitted that the petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence and has been falsely implicated in this case due to village politics. It has been submitted that no offence has been committed by the petitioner against the informant and the petitioner has

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not abused the informant owing to his caste. Ld. counsel has sought to enlarge the petitioner on the privilege of bail.

Ld. Addl. P.P. as well as Ld. Counsel for the informant have opposed the bail petition of the petitioner.

L.C.R. and case diary have been received.

I have heard the submissions and gone through the materials available on the record. It transpires that no bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner either before this Sessions Division or before the Hon'ble High Court and the petitioner does not have any criminal antecedent as revealed from Para 59 of the case diary. It transpires that the instant FIR has been lodged at the instance of informant Sibbu Ravidas alleging therein that on 22.11.2025, accused Ranjit Singh and Tuntun Singh came at his house and asked him to come for the work of labour on which the informant stated that he was not well and would come tomorrow. It is alleged that the accused being infuriated by the answer of the informant not only abused him by his caste but also assaulted him causing fracture of his left leg.

Perusal of the case diary shows that the informant has supported his case in his restatement at Para 13 of the case diary and the witnesses at Para 14, 15 and 16 have also supported the prosecution case. The injury report at Para 26 shows that the doctor found an wound on left leg of the informant and the injury was found grievous in nature which was caused by hard and blunt substance. The independent witnesses at Para 34 have, however, not supported the prosecution case and have stated that the petitioner and the informant used to work as labour at Barbiga and an altercation took place between them and an injury was caused at the left leg of the informant. The informant demanded money for treatment which was not given by the petitioner at that instance and the informant lodged the instant case. Be as it is the allegation against the petitioner is to have abused the informant owing to his caste in public view. The FIR has been lodged u/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 3(5) of B.N.S. and Sec. 3(1)(r), 3(1)(s), 3(2)(va) of SC/ST (POA) Act and in terms of Section 18 of SC/ST (POA) Act. The injury sustained by the injured was found grievous in nature.

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The petitioner is in custody since 27.04.2026. The injury found on the person of the injured was not at the vital part of the body.

Under such circumstances, considering the nature of allegations and its gravity, I am inclined to enlarge the petitioner Ranjit Singh on the privilege of bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with surities of the like amount.

Consequently, bail petition dated 04.05.2026 stands **allowed**.
