ORDER

17.06.2026 Bail petition dated 04.06.2026, filed on behalf of the accused/petitioner Karan Kumar who is in custody since 18.05.2026 in connection with Baughat P.S Case No. 08/2026, under Sections - 309(4) of BNS pressed today.

Pressing the bail petition, learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that no bail petition either regular or anticipatory has been filed or is pending on behalf of the petitioner either before this Sessions Division or before the Hon'ble High Court and the petitioner has a criminal antecedent. It has been further submitted that the petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence and has been falsely implicated in this case. It has been submitted that the FIR has been lodged u/s 309(4) of BNS which is not attracted against the petitioner and no allegation has been leveled against the petitioner in the FIR. It has further been submitted that the petitioner was not arrested at the spot and nothing

incriminating has been seized and recovered from the possession of the petitioner. Ld. Counsel has also submitted that the petitioner has been remanded in this case from Baughat P.S. Case No. 11/2026. Learned counsel has sought to enlarge the petitioner on the privilege of bail.

On the other hand, learned Addl. P.P. has opposed the petition for bail.

L.C.R. and Case diary have been received.

I have heard the submissions and gone through the materials available on the record, it transpires that no other bail petition of any nature is pending on behalf of the petitioner, either before this Sessions Division or before the Hon'ble High Court and petitioner has no criminal antecedent as revealed from Para 70 of the case diary. It transpires that the instant FIR has been instituted at the instance of informant Bambam Kumar alleging therein that he works as C.S.O.(field officer) in Navfince Ltd. having its branch at Lakhisarai. It is alleged that on 09.03.2026 at about 12:00 noon he had come to collect the money and after collecting it was going to Lakhisarai riding on his motorcycle and as soon as reached near Baughat More at the bridge at about 02:00 PM, three assailants riding on a white motorcycle came from Baughat side and dashed his motorcycle. It is alleged that when the informant asked as to why have they dashed his motorcycle, one of the assailants pointed a katta at his temple and took away Rs. 80,080/- from his bag and Rs. 4,000/- from his pocket. The accused also snatched his Realme 13 Pro Mobile having mobile No. 9508640945 and threw it after some time which was recovered by the police.

Perusal of the case diary shows that the informant has supported his case in his restatement at Para 14 and the witnesses at Para 11, 12, 15 and 16 have also supported the prosecution case. The supervising authority at Para 40 has also found the case true. It transpires that the petitioner has confessed his guilt in his confessional statement before the police at Para 48 and has stated that he worked as a liner in the alleged occurrence. It further transpires that the petitioner was remanded in this case from Baughat P.S. Case No. 11/2026. Para 64 of the case diary shows that the co-accused Anjesh Kumar has also confessed his guilt and has also named the petitioner to be one of his associates. It further transpires that the investigation in this case is complete and police has submitted the charge-sheet against the petitioner. It transpires that nothing has been recovered and seized from the

possession of the petitioner and the petitioner is not named in the FIR. The confessional statement before the police does not have any evidentiary value unless it leads to recovery. Apart from the confessional statement of the petitioner, there is nothing on the record to connect the petitioner with the alleged offence. No T.I. Parade was conducted by the I.O. to establish the identification of the petitioner in the alleged offence. Moreover, the petitioner is in custody since 18.05.2026.

Under these circumstances considering the nature of offence and its gravity as well as the fact that nothing has been recovered and seized from the possession of the petitioner and charge-sheet has already been submitted, I deem it fit and proper to enlarge the petitioner Karan Kumar on the privilege of bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount subject to the satisfaction of the Id. Trial Court.

Consequently, the instant bail petition dated 04.06.2026 stands **allowed**.

Let a copy of this order be transmitted to the Id. Trial Court forthwith.
