Anticipatory Bail Petition No. 1040 of 2026 (Dariyapur P.S. Case No. 183/2026)

01	07.07.2026	1. Heard learned counsel representing the petitioners-accused as well as learned Public Prosecutor for the State on anticipatory bail petition of petitioners-accused, namely, i. Rambabu Rai, ii. Ravindra Ray, iii. Rohan Kumar and iv. Rahul Kumar, apprehending their arrest in this Dariyapur P.S. Case No. 183/2026, registered under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 109, 303(2), 118, 351(2) & 352 r/w 3(5) of the BNS, pending in the Court of <i>Ms. Saumya Suman</i>, learned JMFC, Saran at Chapra. 2. FIR of this case has been registered on the basis of a written application of the informant, namely, <i>Arjun Kumar</i>, stating that on 06.03.2026 at about 06:30 A.M., the petitioners-accused, along with other accused persons, allegedly formed an unlawful assembly, armed with sticks, rods and other weapons, and forcibly entered the house of the informant. They allegedly abused the informant and his family members and assaulted them. It is specifically alleged that the petitioner-accused <i>Rambabu Rai</i> struck the informant on the head with an iron rod, causing a grievous head injury. When the informant's grandson <i>Vikki Kumar</i> intervened to rescue him, petitioners-accused <i>Rohan Kumar</i>, <i>Rahul Kumar</i> and co-accused, <i>Sanju Devi</i> allegedly assaulted him, resulting in a head injury. It is further alleged that co-accused, <i>Pinky Kumari</i> and other accused assaulted <i>Saroj Kumar</i>, causing injury to the finger of his left hand. The accused persons also allegedly looted and damaged household articles, jewellery and cash from the informant's house before fleeing away. 3. It is asserted on behalf of learned counsel representing the petitioners-accused that they are quite innocent, have not committed any offence as alleged in the F.I.R. and have falsely been implicated in this case due to a land dispute. Next added that earlier no any regular or anticipatory bail petition has been filed or moved on behalf of the petitioners-accused prior to this either in this Court or Hon'ble High Court Patna, in connection with the present case. Next added that the petitioners-accused have got clean antecedent, except this one. Next asserted that all the allegations levelled against the petitioners-accused are false, fabricated and highly exaggerated. Next added that this case is the counter blast to Dariyapur P.S. Case No. 188/2026, which clearly indicates that the incident was the result of a mutual quarrel between both the parties. Further submitted that the petitioners-accused are ready to furnish sureties as required by the Court. Therefore, it is	



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		prayed that the petitioners-accused may be enlarged on anticipatory bail. 4. Learned Public Prosecutor opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners-accused. 5. Heard both the sides and perused the materials available on record including the case diary. From the same, it appears that the injuries sustained by the injured, <i>prima facie</i> corroborate prosecution version regarding the manner of occurrence. Furthermore, investigation is pending against the petitioners-accused and granting bail at this stage may adversely effect the further investigation process. 6. Hence, considering the seriousness of the offence, the manner of commission of the offence, nature of injury, requirement of proper investigation, and the reasons mentioned herein-above, the petitioners-accused are not entitled to get anticipatory bail. Accordingly, prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners-accused, namely, <i>i. Rambabu Rai, ii. Ravindra Ray, iii. Rohan Kumar and iv. Rahul Kumar</i>, is hereby rejected.
