This bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner namely, Lalan Sahni @ Lalan Kumar in connection with CI Case No. 1072/2023 registered u/s: 498(A) of IPC &amp; 4 of D.P. Act.</p> <p>2. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent and he has been falsely implicated in the case. Further submitted that the case arose out of matrimonial dispute between the parties. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent. He was in custody since 19.09.2025 and vide order dated 19.02.2022 I.d. Predecessor of this court directed the petitioner to be released on interim bail and matter was referred to mediation in Mediation Centre, where both the parties agreed to live together and settled their dispute and said fact has been recorded by learned Mediator in proceeding dated 30.03.2026. Further submitted that presently both the parties are residing together. On these grounds, the learned counsel prayed for confirmation of interim bail granted</p>

3. The learned I/C Special PP does not oppose the prayer for bail as parties have settled their matrimonial dispute.

4. Heard both sides and perused the record.

5. The prosecution's case in nutshell is that complainant namely, Lalita Devi married with Lallan Sahni @ Lalan Kumar on 22.02.2021 as per Hindu Rites and Rituals. Thereafter, she was being subjected to cruelty by the petitioner on account of non-fulfillment of demand a motorcycle and cash Rs. 2,00,000/- in dowry and ultimately she was ousted from the matrimonial house.

6. Perusal of record shows that the petitioner is husband of complainant and due to differences and dispute arose between the parties complainant filed a Complaint CI-1072/2023 alleging therein that the petitioner and other co-accused started demanding 2,00,000/- and motorcycle from her. During hearing of this bail petition, matter was referred to Mediation Centre and both the parties settled their matrimonial dispute and they decided to live together. Proceeding dated 30.03.2026 of Mediation Centre is on record. It has been submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that both the parties- petitioner and complainant are presently living together. Perusal of record shows that vide order dated 19.02.2006, petitioner was granted provisional bail.
