Anticipatory Bail Petition No. 276/2026

Rampari Devi @ Pariya Devi..... Petitioner.

ORDER.

26.03.2026

1. Heard, learned counsel for the petitioner, **Rampari Devi @ Pariya Devi**, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Bela P.S. Case No. 03/2026 registered u/s: 329(3), 126(2), 115(2), 109(1), 303(2), 352, 447, 341, 323, 351(2), 3(5) BNS & 506/34 IPC. Also heard the learned Addl. P.P. for the State, the learned counsel for the informant.

2. That, the prosecution case in brief is that due to a long-standing land dispute with co-accused Pragas Sah and Rambabu Sah, earlier Bela P.S. Case No. 194/2025 was registered regarding assault and snatching of the mobile phone of the plaintiff's son. On 25.12.2025 at about 10:00 A.M., all 9 named accused came to the plaintiff's house armed with iron rods and sticks, abused the plaintiff and started assaulting him. When the plaintiff's wife Sunita Devi, sons Ravi Kumar and Dharmendra Kumar, and granddaughter Karina Devi tried to intervene, they were also assaulted and injured. During the occurrence, accused Ganesh Sah struck Dharmendra Kumar on the head with an iron rod causing serious head injury, while Guddu Sah injured Sunita Devi's hand with a stick. Accused Santosh Sah snatched a gold Hanumani chain from Ravi Kumar. Thereafter, the accused entered the house, broke the box lock, and looted Rs. 20,000. The injured persons were later taken to the hospital, and on the basis of the plaintiff's application, the present case was registered at the police station.


3. It is submitted on behalf of the petitioner that the petitioner is an innocent lady and has been falsely implicated in the present case due to village land dispute. It is further submitted that no specific allegation has been made against the petitioner and the allegations are general and omnibus in nature. It is also submitted that co-accused having similar allegation has already been granted bail by the learned court below. The petitioner is a lady and there is no likelihood of her absconding or tampering with evidence.

4. Learned A.P.P. opposed the prayer for bail.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, nature of allegation being omnibus and general, absence of specific overt act against the petitioner, and the fact that the petitioner is a lady, this Court is inclined to grant the privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

6. Accordingly, it is ordered that the petitioner **Rampari Devi @ Pariya Devi** shall be released on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only) with two sureties of the like amount each, subject to the conditions as laid down u/s. 482(2) of the B.N.S.S.
