Anticipatory Bail Petition No. 338/2026

ORDER.

11.05.2026.

1. Heard, learned counsel for the petitioner, **Dr. Nilambar Jha**, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Sursand P.S. Case No. 199/2025, registered Under Sections- 316(2), 318(4), 271, 272, 125, 61(2), 3(5) B.N.S. and Sections 30(3), 30(2) of the Bihar Clinical Establishments (Registration and Regulation) Act, 2013 and Section 3(B) of the Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (Regulation and Prevention of Misuse) Act, 1994. Also heard the learned Addl. P.P. for the State, the learned counsel for the informant.
2. The prosecution case, in brief, is that on the basis of inspection conducted by a joint team consisting of the Medical Officer In-charge, Community Health Centre, Sursand, Block Development Officer and Officer In-charge, Sursand Police Station, raids were conducted at different clinics and diagnostic centres. During inspection of Modern Ortho Hospital, certain medical articles and treatment related materials were allegedly recovered and the premises were sealed. It is alleged that the clinic was being run illegally.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is innocent and has falsely been implicated in this case. It is further submitted that no specific allegation of administering wrong treatment or conducting any illegal operation has been made against the petitioner. It is also submitted that the petitioner has no criminal antecedent and similarly situated co-accused Rakesh Kumar has already been granted anticipatory bail by the Hon'ble High Court in Cr. Misc. No. 55588/2025. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioner is ready to abide by all terms and conditions imposed by this Court.
4. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, nature of accusation, absence of criminal antecedent and submissions advanced on behalf of the parties, let the petitioner, namely, **Dr. Nilambar Jha**, be released on anticipatory bail in the event of his arrest or surrender within six weeks from the date of this order on furnishing bail bond of Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court concerned subject to the conditions laid down under Section 482(2) B.N.S.S. It is further directed that the petitioner shall file an undertaking before the learned court below that: He shall not use the title "Doctor/Dr." with his name. He shall not use any proxy name, fake identity or

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misleading designation for medical practice. He shall not run any clinic, hospital, diagnostic centre or medical establishment anywhere without valid legal authorization and registration from the competent authority. A copy of the aforesaid undertaking shall also be prominently pasted/displayed at the place where the alleged clinic/establishment was being run. Violation of any of the aforesaid conditions shall entail cancellation of bail. With the proof of having displayed at the said medical establishment.
