By this order we are going to dispose off the anticipatory bail application filed on behalf of accused/ petitioners, namely 1. Koshila Devi @ Asha Devi, 2.Kiran Kumari @ Sabita Kumari, 3. Kalamwati Devi, 4. Pujan Devi and 5. Beena Devi, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Ratanpura PS Case No.:-99/2025, u/s- 191(2), 191(3), 190, 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 117(2), 109, 132, 121, 122, 262, 263,352, 351(2), 351(3) of B.N.S.

Ld. counsel for the accused/ petitioners argued that accused/ petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no crime and they have falsely been implicated in this case due to dirty village politics. He further submitted that accused/ petitioners have not involved in any other case and having the clean antecedent. He further submitted that the offence as alleged in FIR is not applicable against the accused/ petitioners. It is also submitted that accused/ petitioners are ready to abide by the provisions of section 482 of B.N.S.S, so they may be admitted to the anticipatory bail.

Ld. PP for the State strongly opposed the anticipatory bail application.

In brief, the prosecution story is that on dated 20.12.2025 a police team lead by Sub-Inspector, Raju Kumar reached at village Piprahi, Ward No.01 at the house of Ramratan Rai at about 02:15 A.M., for the investigation of a case bearing Ratanpura PS Case No.88/25 of Bihar Excise Act and the police team overpowered Ramratan Rai and in the meantime 8 accused persons named in FIR including these accused/ petitioners came there and forcibly tried to take away the accused Ramratan Rai and also assaulted the police party by stick and iron-rod, thereby Sub-Inspector, Raju Kumar sustained injury on his nose and accused

accused Ramratan Rai managed to run away from the place of occurrence. However, his brother Raushan Kumar Rai was overpowered by the police party.

Argument heard from both sides and perused the record as well as case diary. On going through the case diary, it transpires that the allegation against the accused/ petitioners is that creating the hindrance in the performance of the duty of a police team. The members of the raiding party namely Sub-Inspector, Ajit Kumar Pandey, Sub-Inspector, Sumit Kumar Singh and constable Swarnabh Sanu have duly supported the prosecution case. As per para No.28 of the case diary, these accused/ petitioners have not involved in any other case and having the clean antecedent. On minute scrutiny of the entire case diary, it transpires that these accused/ petitioners were implicated in this case only on the basis of family members of the main accused Ramratan Rai. So far as the injury report is concerned, I.O. has not collected the injury report of the injured/ informant. The allegation against the accused/ petitioners are general in nature. Moreover, all the accused/ petitioners are ladies.

Hence, keeping in mind the nature of allegation and the clean antecedent of the accused/ petitioners, I find that all the accused/ petitioners are entitled to get the benefit of anticipatory bail. Therefore, the prayer for anticipatory bail of all the accused/ petitioners stands **Allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender before the court within 15 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, they are directed to be released on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.20,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of Learned Court below with condition that they shall abide by all the conditions laid down in section 482 of B.N.S.S and one of the bailor must be family member or close relative.
