Anticipatory Bail Petition No. 657/2026

ORDER

1. Ld. Counsel moves this anticipatory bail petition on behalf of accused petitioner namely **(1) Sonu Kumar**, who apprehends his arrest in connection with Daraunda P.S. Case No. 466/2025 registered u/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 109, 3(5) of BNS.

2. Ld. Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence, rather he has falsely been implicated in this case. Petitioner bears no criminal antecedent. The allegations as narrated in the FIR is totally false, baseless and concocted. There is no chance of his absconding and tampering with the evidence. Hence, Ld. Counsel prays for anticipatory bail.

3. On the other hand, Ld. P.P opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail.

4. Heard. Perused the record.

5. From perusal of the record, it transpires that an FIR vide Daraundha P.S Case No. 466/2025 was registered on 25.09.2025 u/s 126(2), 115(1), 118(1), 109, 3/5 of BNS against the petitioner along with other co-accused persons. As per FIR, the informant alleged that on 24.09.2025 at about 7:00 P.M, the informant along with his family members were taking tea. Further, as per FIR, Yogesh Kumar along with other co-accused persons came from Delhi with plan to kill. Thereafter, Yogesh Kumar and Sonu Kumar (petitioner) gave chaku blow to informant and his son Akhilesh Kumar.

6. From perusal of record, it appears that there is allegation against the petitioner that he along with co-accused Yogesh Kumar gave chaku blow to informant and his son Akhilesh Kumar. From perusal of injury reports of informant and his son, it appears that they sustained simple injury. Moreover, both the parties are pattidar.

7. As per para-3 of the bail petition as well as para-32 of the photo copy of case diary, it appears that petitioner bears no criminal antecedent.

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8. Considering the aforesaid facts, the present anticipatory bail petition is **allowed.**

9. It is directed that in the event of his arrest or surrender before learned trial court within six weeks, the petitioner shall be released on furnishing by him bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to conditions as mentioned under section 482 of BNSS.
