ORDER

23.03.2026

1. The present bail application has been filed on behalf of the accused-petitioner namely **Sunil Singh**, who is in judicial custody since 28.02.2026 in connection with Siwan (T) P.S. Case No. 225/2026 allegedly instituted for the offences under section 305(b), 303(2) of BNS and on 28.02.2026 added section 317(2) of BNS.

2. Ld. Counsel of the petitioner submits that the petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence rather he has falsely been implicated in this case. Petitioner bears one criminal antecedent. Ld. counsel further submits that petitioner is not named in the FIR and his name surfaced in this case on the confessional statement of co-accused Munna Kumar. Nothing incriminating article has been recovered either from the person or possession of the petitioner. Petitioner is in judicial custody since 28.02.2026. There is no chance of his absconding or tampering with the prosecution evidence. Hence, Ld. counsel prays for bail.

3. On the other hand, Ld. P.P vehemently opposes the prayer of bail.

4. Heard, perused record.

5. From perusal of the record, it transpires that an FIR *vide*-Siwan (T) P.S. Case No. 225/2026 was allegedly instituted on 26.02.2026 for the offences under section 305(b), 303(2) of BNS and on 28.02.2026 added section 317(2) of BNS against unknown. As per F.I.R, the informant alleged that his Toto bearing registration no. BR29ER3217 has been stolen in front of the Sadar Hospital, Siwan.

6. From perusal of record, it appears that petitioner is not named in the FIR and his name has been surfaced in this case on the confessional statement of Munna Kumar. No T.I.P has been conducted by police. Moreover, petitioner is in judicial custody since 28.02.2025.

7. As per para-3 of the bail petition as well as para-32 of the photo copy of case diary, it appears that petitioner bears one criminal antecedent.

8. Considering the aforesaid facts and custody period of the petitioner, the present bail application is **allowed**, the petitioner is directed to be released

If the petitioner is subsequently found indulged in similar offences, the learned trial court shall take steps for cancellation of his bail bond.**
