ORDER

1. Learned counsel for the petitioner moves the present anticipatory bail application filed on behalf of the accused-petitioner namely **(1) Bittu Bharti**, who apprehends his arrest in connection with Maharajganj P.S. Case No. 479/2025 registered u/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 109, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of BNS.

2. Learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence, rather he has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that no bail petition was earlier been filed or moved on behalf of the petitioner either before this learned Court or the Hon'ble High Court at Patna after lodging FIR. Petitioner has got no criminal antecedent. The allegations as narrated in the FIR is totally false, baseless and concocted. There is no specific allegation against the petitioner. There is no chance of his absconding and tampering with the evidence. Hence, Ld. Counsel prays for anticipatory bail.

3. On the other hand, Ld. P.P vehemently opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail.

4. Heard. Perused the record.

5. From perusal of the record, it appears that an FIR vide Maharajganj P.S Case No. 479/2025 was registered on 22.09.2025 u/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 109, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of BNS against the petitioner along with other co-accused persons. As per FIR, the informant alleged that on 21.09.2025 at about 1:00 P.M, his pattidar petitioner along with other co-accused persons started hurling abuses, when the informant's son went to demand his money Rs. 17,000/-. When the informant's son objected, all the accused persons assaulted with lathi-danda. It is further alleged that petitioner gave stab wound on the chest of informant, as the

result, informant sustained injury on his hand. It is further alleged that Bittu also gave knife blow in the stomach of Govind Kumar Bharti and Lalu Bharti.

6. There is specific allegation against the petitioner. From perusal of injury reports of injured, it appears that they sustained simple injury. Moreover, both the parties are pattidar.

7. As per para-3 of the bail petition as well as para-48 of the photo copy of case diary, it appears that petitioner bears clean criminal antecedent.

8. Considering the aforesaid facts, the present anticipatory bail petition is **allowed**. It is directed that in the event of his arrest or surrender before learned trial court within six weeks, the petitioner shall be released on furnishing by him bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to conditions as mentioned under section 482 of BNSS.
