Anticipatory Bail Petition No. 776/2026

ORDER

29.04.2026

1. Ld. Counsel moves this anticipatory bail petition on behalf of accused petitioner namely **(1) Swaminath Mehtar**, who apprehends his arrest in connection with M.H Nagar P.S. Case No. 90/2026 registered u/s 191(1), 126(2), 115(2), 109, 74, 352 of BNS.

2. Ld. Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence, rather he has falsely been implicated in this case. Petitioner bears no criminal antecedent. The allegations as narrated in the FIR is totally false, baseless and concocted. There is no chance of his absconding and tampering with the evidence. Hence, Ld. Counsel prays for anticipatory bail.

3. On the other hand, Ld. P.P opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail.

4. Heard. Perused the record.

5. From perusal of the record, it transpires that an F.I.R vide M.H Nagar P.S. Case No. 90/2026 was registered on 03.03.2026 u/s 191(1), 126(2), 115(2), 109, 74, 352 of BNS against the petitioner along with other co-accused persons. As per FIR, the informant alleged that on 03.03.2026 at about 3:00 P.M, she had gone to meet with her daughter to Laheji Swaminath Orchestra, Laheji, where her daughter was dancer in the said orchestra. In the meantime, some villagers of Laheji Bazaar started hurling abuses and assaulted the informant. It is alleged that petitioner along with other co-accused persons were involved in the said occurrence.

6. From perusal of record, it appears that there is general and omnibus allegation against the petitioners. From perusal of injury report of informant it appears that she sustained simple injury.

7. As per para-3 of the bail petition as well as para-15 of the photo copy of case diary, it appears that petitioner bears no criminal antecedent.

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8. Considering the aforesaid facts and the fact that there is general and omnibus allegation against the petitioner, the present anticipatory bail petition is **allowed**.

9. It is directed that in the event of his arrest or surrender before learned trial court within six weeks, the petitioner shall be released on furnishing by him bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to conditions as mentioned under section 482 of BNSS.
