ORDER

1. The present bail application has been filed on behalf of the accused-petitioner namely **(1) Rohit Kumar**, who is in judicial custody since 28.03.2026 in connection with Barharia P.S Case No. 145/2026 registered u/s 126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109(1), 351(3), 352, 3(5) of BNS & 27 Arms Act.

2. Ld. Counsel of the petitioner submits that the petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence, rather he has falsely been implicated in this case. The petitioner has got one criminal antecedent. Ld. Counsel further submits that there is no allegation as alleged in the FIR is made out against the petitioner. Petitioner is in judicial custody since 28.03.2026. There is no chance of his absconding or tampering with the prosecution evidence. Hence, learned counsel prays for bail.

3. On the other hand, Ld. P.P opposes the prayer of bail.

4. Heard. Perused the record.

5. From perusal of the record, it transpires that an FIR vide Barharia P.S Case No. 145/2026 was registered on 27.03.2026 u/s 126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109(1), 351(3), 352, 3(5) of BNS & 27 Arms Act against the petitioner along with other co-accused persons. As per FIR, the informant alleged that on 26.03.2026 at about 8:00 P.M, he was coming from Gadha More, in the meantime, petitioner along with other co-accused persons assaulted on the head of informant with pistol and Kara and fired with pistol.

6. From perusal of record, it appears that there is general and omnibus allegation against the petitioner and from perusal of injury report of informant, it appears that after NCCT of head, doctor found no significant abnormality is seen in brain parenchyma. Moreover, petitioner is in judicial custody since 28.03.2026.

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7. As per para-3 of the bail petition as well as para-42 of the case diary, it appears that petitioner bears one criminal antecedent.

8. Considering the aforesaid facts and custody period of the petitioner, the present bail application is **allowed**, the petitioner is directed to be released immediately on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the court below.
