Anticipatory Bail Petition No. 1183/2026

ORDER

26.05.2026

1. Ld. Counsel moves this anticipatory bail petition on behalf of accused petitioners namely **(1) Sanjay Tiwari, (2) Pankaj Pandey, (3) Kunal Pandey, (4) Penter Tiwari**, who apprehend their arrest in connection with Siwan (Town) P.S. Case No. 214/2026 registered u/s 303(2) and on 08.03.2026 added section 111 BNS.

2. Ld. Counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioners are innocent and have committed no offence rather they have falsely been implicated in this case. Petitioners bear no criminal antecedent. The allegation levelled against the petitioners is totally false, baseless & concocted. Ld. counsel further submits that both the parties have compromised the case. There is no chance of their absconding and tampering with the evidence. Hence, Ld. counsel prays for anticipatory bail.

3. On the other hand, learned P.P vehemently opposes the prayer of bail.

4. Heard. Perused the record.

5. From perusal of the record, it transpires that an FIR vide Siwan Town P.S. Case No. 214/2026 was registered on 24.02.2026 u/s 303(2) and on order dated 08.03.2026 added section 111 of BNS against unknown. As per FIR, the informant alleged that on 24.02.2026 at about 02:20 o'clock, while the informant was coming out from the Siwan Post Office after withdrawing Rs. 50,000/-, thereafter he saw that his purse/pocket was cut and money was stealthy taken by unknown.

6. From perusal of record, it appears that petitioners are not named in the FIR. During hearing of the bail petition, informant appeared before the court and submitted that good sense has prevailed between them.

7. As per para-3 of the bail petition, it appears that petitioners bear no criminal antecedent.

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8. Considering the aforesaid facts, the present anticipatory bail petition is **allowed**.

9. It is directed that in the event of their arrest or surrender before learned trial court within six weeks, the petitioners shall be released on furnishing by them bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to conditions as mentioned under section 482 of BNSS.
