ORDER

22.06.2026

This anticipatory bail petition **dated 02.06.2026** in anticipation of his arrest is filed on behalf of the accused-petitioner **Halima Khatun** in connection with Hussainganj P.S. Case No. 198/2026 under Section - 126(2), 115(2), 109, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of BNS, the copy of which is served upon the ld. P.P.

Sh. Kumar Anand, the ld. Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is quite innocent and committed no offence. The prosecution story is totally false, concocted and baseless. No bail petition either regular or anticipatory has been filed or pressed either before this Court or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. The petitioner has got clean past except this false case no other case had ever been registered against her. It is further submitted that the petitioner is close family members and the petitioner has falsely been implicated in the present case due to family and domestic dispute relating to household affairs and electricity connection between close agnates and there is no any overt act of serious assault had been attributed to this petitioner. The co-accused has already been enlarged on bail by ld. Trial Court and further submitted that the matter has been compromised between the parties. There is no chance of his absconding or tampering with the prosecution evidence. The petitioner is ready to furnish his bail bond to the satisfaction of the Court. In such view the ld. Counsel prayed to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

Sh. Ranjan Kumar Srivastava, the ld. Addl. PP opposed the prayer of bail.

On perusal of the case record, it is clear that on the basis of the written application, this case was registered. The prosecution story in nut shell is that the informant Tamanna Parveen alleged that on 15.05.2026 at about 3:00 P.M, while she was alone at home, a dispute relating to electricity connection. The petitioner who is sister-in-law of the informant alongwith co-accused Muhammad Daroga, allegedly abused her and, upon her protest, assaulted her with a bamboo stick, causing injuries to her waist and back. It is further alleged that accused Muhammad Daroga assaulted her on the head by means of bamboo stick causing on her head injury. Thereafter, she was taken for medical treatment.

Further the Court finds that the dispute between the parties has been compromised and good relations have been restored between both the parties and a compromised petition

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is available on record which is duly signed by both the parties. It further appears that the co-accused has already been enlarged on bail by the learned Court below. The petitioner is an elderly lady aged about 61 years and has no criminal antecedent. From the injury report available on record, it transpires that the injuries sustained by the informant, Tamanna Parveen, are simple in nature. Moreover, no specific overt act or distinct role of assault has been attributed to the present petitioner namely Halima Khatun.

Therefore, considering the facts and circumstances of this case, having regard to the arguments placed by both the parties, the petitioner **Halima Khatun** is directed to be released on bail, in the event of his arrest or surrender before the Court below within **30 days from today** on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the Court below.

Accordingly the anticipatory bail petition **dated 02.06.2026 stands allowed.**
