Anticipatory Bail Petition No. 365/2026

ORDER

23.04.2026

1. Ld. Counsel moves this anticipatory bail petition on behalf of accused petitioner namely **(1) Rakesh Yadav**, who apprehends his arrest in connection with Andar P.S. Case No. 211/2025 registered u/s 305(c) of BNS.

2. Ld. Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence, rather he has falsely been implicated in this case. Petitioner bears no criminal antecedent. The allegations as narrated in the FIR is totally false, baseless and concocted. Ld. Counsel further submits that no such type of occurrence has ever taken place. The occurrence is of 07.07.2025, but the FIR has been registered on 15.07.2025 without any explanation. There is no chance of his absconding and tampering with the evidence. Hence, Ld. Counsel prays for anticipatory bail.

3. On the other hand, Ld. P.P opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail.

4. Heard. Perused the record.

5. From perusal of the record, it transpires that an F.I.R vide Andar P.S. Case No. 211/2025 was registered on 15.07.2025 u/s 305(c) of BNS against the petitioner along with unknown. As per FIR, the informant alleged that on 07.07.2025, three unknown persons have stolen the battery bearing S/No. CDI60234314878 of his school bus, in which one of them has identified as Rakesh Yadav (petitioner).

6. From perusal of record, it appears that there is allegation against the petitioner of stolen the battery of informant's school bus. No T.I.P has been conducted by the police. The case is of 07.07.2025, but the FIR has been registered on 15.07.2025 without any plausible explanation.

7. As per para-3 of the bail petition as well as para-51 of the photo copy of case diary, it appears that petitioner bears no criminal antecedent.

8. Considering the aforesaid facts, the present anticipatory bail petition is **allowed.**

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9. It is directed that in the event of his arrest or surrender before learned trial court within six weeks, the petitioner shall be released on furnishing by him bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to conditions as mentioned under section 482 of BNSS.
