Heard the learned defence counsel as well as learned Public Prosecutor on the anticipatory bail application filed on behalf of the above named accused petitioners under section 482 of B.N.S.S. who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Bhagwanpur P.S. Case No. 376/2025 registered u/ss. 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 352, 351(2) 109, 3(5) & 85 of B.N.S.

It is stated in Para 2 of the anticipatory bail petition that no bail application either anticipatory or regular has been filed in the present case either before this court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna.

The prosecution case in brief, as per written report of the informant Ravi Kumar is that his sister Manisha Devi was married with Sonu Mahto. Her sister was badly assaulted by her husband Sonu. The other accused persons as named in the F.I.R. including the petitioners were also involved in the alleged Mar-pit. His sister is badly injured and she is not able to speak. Earlier also Mar-pit was committed with his sister

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are innocent and have committed no offence. No occurrence as alleged took place. They have been falsely implicated in this case. There is general and omnibus allegation against

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the petitioners. The petitioner no.1 has criminal antecedent of one case and petitioner no.2 has no criminal antecedent. Hence, prayer has been made for anticipatory bail.

Learned Public prosecutor opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Heard the parties and perused the record. From perusal of record, it appears that there is general and omnibus allegation against the petitioners of committing Mar-pit with the informant's sister. Petitioners are uncle and father of the husband of informant's sister Manisha Devi. The informant Ravi Kumar and his sister Manisha Devi appeared physically and filed a petition stating therein that they have settled the dispute with the accused persons and now there is no any dispute between them and also a compromise petition has already been filed in the trial court. They also filed a photo copy of sale deed and stated that grand father-in-law of Manisha Devi namely Maheshwar Mahto has executed a sale deed in her favour with respect to the land of the share of her husband Sonu.

Therefore, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the above named petitioners, is hereby, allowed and it is ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender, they will be enlarged on anticipatory bail, on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below, within four weeks of this order, subject to the conditions as laid down under section 482(2) of the Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita 2023.
